Friend, Nebraska, conveyed to us the sad news of the death on the Monday previous at her husband's residence near Friend, of Elizabeth Olds, wife of David Blanchard, an Englishman, who was a farmer resident of Greenbush. Mrs. Blanchard had been in poor health for some months past, but was not considered at all dangerous as she was able to sit around and assist in the household. On the Saturday before her death she got breakfast and done some cooking and about six o'clock in the evening was taken violently ill with a gripe and after suffering dreadfully until two a.m. on Monday morning she passed away. The physician who attended her, gave as his opinion that she could not, from the nature of her disease, have lived more than a few weeks, even if she had not been attacked with the gripe. Mrs. Blanchard was the youngest daughter of the late James Olds, and was born and always resided in the vicinity of Greenbush, until the family removed to Nebraska, some nine years ago. About two years ago she returned to Canada and spent several months in visiting her numerous friends and relatives in Canada and New York State. Mr. James Olds of Brier Hill, St. Law Co., is now the only surviving one of the large family left by the late James Olds of Greenbush. On Tuesday all that was mortal of a loving wife, a kind and indulgent mother and a warm friend, was laid in the silent tomb, all the members of family being present, excepting their son Clarence, who resides near Addison.
