The regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of Athens was held on Wednesday last, 8th inst.

On motion the Clerk was authorized to purchase for the use of the council one volume of Harrison's Municipal Manual, 5th edition.

On motion, Chief of Police Phillips was authorized to collect from all parties opening shop or grocery stands in this village on the 15th inst., and for use of street stands, the following fees, one horse rig thereon, \$1, two horse rig \$2, and for persons using a street stand \$5, and that he be allowed 10 per cent for collecting same.

Joseph Kerr appealed to the council for help for Mrs. Elizabeth Pierce, who lately lost her husband, and had two small children to support.

The council then adjourned until 2nd Wednesday in August, unless sooner called by Reeve.

Special Reporter. Ashwood Hall, July 9.—The attendance of gentlemen interested in cheese this afternoon was the largest of the season, though not productive of fancy prices. The offerings go on record as the largest of the season, a fraction over 8000 boxes were checked on the bulletin board for the auctioneer to wield his hammer over, 2,894 of which were colored, 1 1/2 balance being white.
