## PREIT IN SUMMER.

This is the Time of Year When Fruit is Medicine.

"Some people," sagely remarks the New York Sun, "look upon fruit as a luxury and not a necessity, and live on coarse greasy food until disease overtakes them and warns them to change their diet. It is absolutely necessary to teach some a severe lesson before they obey the laws of naval exhibition.

"But why not eat fruit freely ! It is plentiful enough. "The Pacific coast is sending us peaches, plams, apricots and cherries. The South is supplying us with melons, cantaloupes, blackberries, green apples, grapes, pears, etc. Tropical America is stocking our fruit stalls and warehouses with bananas, pineapples, alligator pears, sapodilla plums, custard apples, cherrimoyers, green or jelly cocoanuts, mammee apples and many other fruits, the names of which are unpronounceable. Yet better than all these are our native currants and raspberries. "If the Board of Health would compel

each inhabitant to eat at least a quart of currants daily there would be little use for the sanitary corps of that department. "A more delightful breakfast invigorator than a combination of currants and raspberries would be hard to find. The tameness of the raspberry blends perfectly with acidity of the currant.

### TESTING STRENGTH OF YARNS.

strain that samples of yarn will bear. Heretofore much has depended on the skill of the person making the test, which must be made by the application of a dead weight. As there is difficulty in slowly inccreasing the weight without shock or vibration. yarn tests have sellom been free from !

In a machine recently invented by an Englishman the difficulties in testing yarn have been practically overcome, the dead weight being gradually increased spfferings of the Crew of the Campadre at by a simple contrivance. A small cylinder is filled with oil which will flow easily, a connection being established beof a small tube. About midway of this tube is a regulating tap by which the movement of the oil can be readily controlled.
