**THE HOTEL DE KINNEY.**  
Our horse being safely housed, we are taken in hand by the proprietor of the house, Mr. Thos. Kinney, and shown through the building. It was built to satisfy the requirements of the tourists and pleasure seekers who visit the Falls on their way to the city of Ottawa, and like the majority of such buildings, is a model of cleanliness and sanitation. Hygienic excellence are the chief requisites of a summer hotel, and these have been given due consideration by Mr. Kinney. The most important room in the house, so we are pleased to be able to add that the neatness and order about correctly indicates the character of this room. It is large, airy, and absolutely "flyless"; the tables are well furnished and well supplied with seasonable dishes well cooked. This has been a good year at the Falls.

**THE FISHING.**  
serving to attract many lovers of the rod from their old haunts. The waters of the Rideau are too large for the amount of fishing to be done on a day's angling here, and so large parties of Americans leave the fish-boat at Lawrence, and steaming up the Rideau in their yachts, or by the regular line boats, here find the goal of their desires—beautiful surroundings and fishing par excellence. These "day" anglers arrive a party of five captured still-fishing in two hours, 210 shiners. Many different kinds of fish are called "shiners", but the shiner here is a bass-shaped, silver-sealed beauty weighing from 3 to 1½ lbs. The black-bass fishing is unexcelled in the province. These fighting favorites are found above and below the locks, but it is to Troy lake we must turn to find black bass extraordinary. This lake, though only about a mile distant, is difficult of access, and no boats being kept there, it is comparatively inaccessible. A great catch has been taken there about a month ago by a party of Americans, and last season we saw a black bass from that lake which tipped the scales at 5½ lbs.

**MANY CAMPING PARTIES**  
from Kingston, Ottawa and intervening towns and villages pitch their tents here, and it would be difficult indeed to find a more beautiful camping ground, California Grove, as well as the wooded land more contiguous to the locks, has been cleaned and trimmed, and presents the appearance of a well-kept park, and it is here that the campers are found. Though many are contemplated, as yet but one summer residence has been erected—that of Mr. Phil. Halladay, of Elgin, which is situated on an island in "Dundas Bay," a half-mile below the locks. The cottage is nicely proportioned, well finished within and without, commands a good view of the locks and of all passing steamers, and presents a fine appearance from the lake, being built at the apex of a grassy slope, extending to the water's edge, while behind a wall of foliage forms a pleasing background. Surrounding the cottage are many pleasant walks which lead through a perfect labyrinth of shrubbery and small trees to the high rocks beyond, from which a pleasant view can be obtained. At a great gate, the end of the island is "Barnes Park," the property of Mr. Jas. Barnes, of Toronto. The ferns on the islands and in the woods adjacent to the Falls is varied, extensive, and rich in coloring—some

**THE CAVE.**  
which is about a mile and a half from the Falls, the course lying by Sunset Bay, Rideau Park, and through a narrow water-way between high rocks into a long, sheltered bay, at the end of which is the Cave. So easy is it of access that when we lowered our main-sail the flying-gib was within the mouth of the cavern. The main entrance is from the water, and the visitor at once finds himself in the chief room of Nature's rocky castle. The sides and floor are rough, the ceiling is a smooth, silty deposit of brown paper we secured our prize. About 10 a.m. under competent and congenial pilotage, we "spread out our white wings" and sailed.

Standing on its summit, with a good glass, Kingston can be discerned, and nearer, the well remembered form of Blue Mountain. The magnificent crops in Lassard's orchard at Front of York are well known in the agricultural circles that were mown in many localities about the 20th of June, and which threatened to become universally epidemic. The threat for novelty and sensation in man is so important that he will not hesitate to get up a famine on the smallest pretext. But July with her mighty trains laden with prosperity from the invisible chemical processes, and boundless resources in Nature's laboratory have swept over the land and redeemed it from doubt and want and made chief of the year prediction at the last moment. And as the passage through the Red Sea opens, the grateful farmer recognizes the supremacy of a kind providence. Bee-keeping in the township above named is steadily expanding and increasing in value. This is true also on the river bank and on the islands. While at Mr. Henry Hunt's, a gentleman well known as a successful island farmer, (a resident for forty-five years on Fern Island, and deeply interested in bees) and who on the middle of the river watching the bees working on the basswood on the mainland. When a bee comes to a conclusion and forms a decided opinion he has never been known to change that opinion, except when struck with a sudden blast of smoke, which is the only known influence that will throw a bee completely off his base, upon his gravity and annihilate his gnatism—make him willing to divide.
