MY DEAR FRIEND SLOAN, -At the end of

the first stage of our journey inland, 300 miles from where we started at the coast, I am sitting in a small native mud but, my tent being used for storing my cloth, heads and provisions when not on the march, as the hut is much warmer, and the nights are very cold. They would not be considered cold in Canada, but the thermometer in my tent often stands at 35 o in the night, while it runs up to 90 o in the day. I have been here for four weeks, waiting to collect and engage carriers for the next stage of our journey into the heart of Africa. But as some who came from the coast wish to go farther with us "they beg us to tarry, not until their beards are grown," but until the skin worn off their feet by the long marches over the sandy plains is healed up a bit. We expect to strike camp in four days' time and make a move.
