DEER HUNTING OUT NOBLE.

The scribe of the Reporter recounts this story and varied experience while hunting for Game in the Wilderness.

Although Josiah is not an American by birth, his manner of speech partakes largely of that nasal twang peculiar to a genuine "down East". On the night referred to in our last he was in good spirits, and dropping down on a log of wood in a warm corner of the tent, proceeded to tell the following story of what occurred on one of his hunting trips:

It was about the first of November, a few years ago, that I started out on a hunting expedition to the north woods. I engaged a lad of some 20 years, named Julius Caesar, to go along as assistant. Our outfit consisted of a heavy one-horse wagon loaded with provisions, traps, bedding, guns, ammunition and a light skiff. The weight of the load and the age of the horse made our progress very slow and when on the road some three days away the horse gave out and we concluded to stop over in order to recuperate him. Just at dark we reached the house of a farmer, who in answer to our request for shelter, gladly consented, giving at the same time the pleasing information that there was a lake only a short distance away which abounded with fur-bearing animals, while the surrounding hills were said to be literally alive with deer. As neither party had any dogs it was proposed by the host that we should slip across the country to a neighbor's and steal one for a day or two, and that Julius Caesar and I should take the boat on our shoulders down to the shore of the lake and set traps until we heard the sound of the hound's voice, when we were to take stations to intercept the deer as he took to the water. The day was bitter cold, with ice forming on the bays, so that the task of waiting was by no means pleasant. Fortunately we had not long to wait. Julius was put on a point to go to a runway and I pulled my boat into a sheltered nook, kindled a fire and sat down to warm my hands and thaw the ice out of my whiskers. Looking out on the lake, I saw a fine large buck followed closely in the rear by my host, Joab, in a small birch bark canoe. Jumping into my skiff I started out to cut off the retreat of the animal and when within a dozen yards of him I took up my gun to shoot. "Don't! don't!" shouted Joab. "I must be the hunter that kills that deer." The gun was lowered and a wait made for Joab to come up and dispatch the animal. As he came up he informed me that he always killed his game with a club, and wanted me to row on ahead and drive the deer back to him while he was getting his club ready. I soon had the animal within striking distance and Joab made a tremendous stroke at its head, with no other result than to break off the tip of one prong. The club flew out of his hands and went skipping along the water for two or three rods. The deer made a lunge when struck and passed close to my boat, but as Joab still insisted on doing the killing I gave him one of my ears and he started off the deer again. He paddled alongside and struck him a vigorous blow across the shoulders with no other result than to give my ear a bad break. The deer in its efforts to get away from Joab, rushed right alongside of my boat, and I reached out and caught him by the tail. By this time I was out of patience with Joab and concluded to put an end to the struggle by quietly entering the deer's throat with my javelin. Keeping a firm hold on the deer's tail with one hand, I reached for my knife with the other and catching the blade in my teeth, I began to work my way alongside so as to get hold of his horns. This I succeeded in doing and finally got a good hold of its antlers
