Dr. Washington has been visiting the principal throat and lung hospitals in London and elsewhere.

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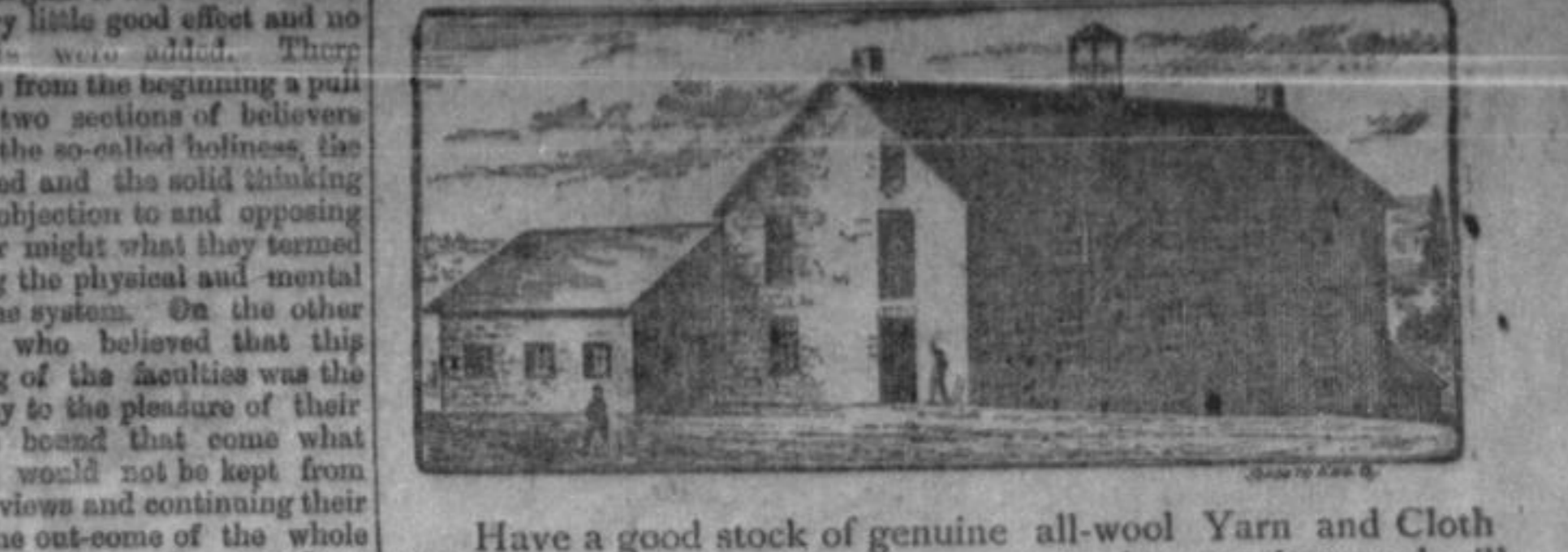
