FROM OVER THE SEA. The Siamese Blockade Formally Raised by Admiral Humann. BRITISH SHIPS NOT WITHDRAWN

A Decision Favorable to Canada Said to Have Been Reached - The Barking Ship - The Naval Brought Over - The Defenders Win.

PARIS, Aug. 7. - M. Pavis has cabled to Minister Deville the report of Siam's official acceptance of the French ultimatum. This contains everything effected through Prince Valdein, Siamese Minister to France.

NEW YORK, Aug. 7. - The Herald prints the following cable from Bangkok: The Saigon papers say there was some severe fighting between the Siamese and the French on July 29 on the Mekong river.

NAVY. The Canadian cycling champion, was captured at Detroit yesterday. He was taken to a military hospital.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 4. About 200 farmers from Addington and Frontenac visited the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, yesterday.

DEFENDERS SUCCESSFUL. LONDON, Aug. 7. - The empire in the naval contest between the Red fleet, commanded by Vice-Admiral Fairfax, and the Blue fleet, under the command of Rear Admiral Fitzroy, have decided that the Red fleet, which was assumed to be the fleet of an enemy, failed in its object, and have awarded the victory to the Blue.

AN EXPENSIVE BLAZE. LIVERPOOL, Aug. 7. - Fire broke out on Saturday night in a timber yard adjoining the Mersey docks on the house of the late Liverpool and Boston. Timber and other property covering three acres were destroyed. Loss, £190,000.

THE REMAINS OF MRS. BARRETT FOUND IN ROSSETTE - DIED OF EXHAUSTION. TORONTO, Aug. 7. - The body of Mrs. R. G. Barrett, the aged lady who has been missing for several days from her home, 187 Bloor street east, was found in the woods of Chazy Park.

ROWING AT HAMILTON. CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF AMATEUR OARSMEN. HAMILTON, Aug. 7. - About 5,000 people witnessed the final races of the C. A. O. regatta. The races were rowed on the lake side course, 14 miles straight away.

QUEBEC'S FINE STOCK. MONTREAL, Aug. 7. - The man, Matthew, who made such a desperate attempt to murder his wife, yesterday, was sentenced to the Police Court before Judge Ange and was remanded for sentence.

DEATH OF JUDGE DAVIS. NEW CARLETON, Que., Aug. 7. - Judge Davis, of London, died at New Carleton on Saturday from heart disease. He left London, Ont., a couple of weeks ago. He was travelling for his health and spent a week at Big Lake, left for New Carleton, where he arrived on the 29th July, and was boarding at Mrs. D. C. Amond's.

ANOTHER DROWNED WHITE BATHING. BRUNSWICK, Aug. 7. - Clement Buff, of this place, was drowned yesterday while bathing in Whitaker Lake, near here.

W. G. PARISH. A financial panic prevails in Costa Rica, due to the condition of the silver market. The Pope has ordered the Catholic inhabitants of Naples not to fast as long as the cholera prevails.

FRANK VAN LEON, the Columbus Grove bank robber and murderer, was hanged at Columbia, O., yesterday.

W. C. S. MITCHELL, the president of the Leicestershire Iron and Steel Company, died in Edinburgh, Scotland, on Thursday.

RUSSIA HAS STILL FURTHER RAISED THE TARIFF ON GERMAN PRODUCTS. A despatch received in New York states that peace has been restored in Nicaragua.

THE ITALIAN CATHOLIC MISSION AT MIEN HYANG, 90 miles from Hankow, China, has been destroyed by native rioters.

THE EXCHANGE BANKS OF INDIA HAVE APPEALED TO GREAT BRITAIN AGAINST THE REFUSAL OF THE INDIAN GOVERNMENT TO MODIFY THE TERMS OF THE INDIAN FAIR.
