MANITOBA LETTERS.

An Interesting, Practical Account of the Climate and Farming Operations.

Boissavane, Oct. 5, 1893.

Editor Athens Reporter.—

Sir,—Having been requested by a friend to send a letter to be published in your paper, I hope you will allow me the space in the columns of your paper for a few words about Manitoba. I suppose a letter from Manitoba would be very interesting to the people of Athens and its surrounding country. I will endeavor to give a short history of the province for this year, and of the winters we have had here. I suppose many people wonder what the winters in Manitoba are like. As a rule, one year with another, the snow comes on about the middle of November, and it is steady from freeze until March. The thermometer goes from 30 to 60 degrees in the cold weather. It depends a great deal on the wind; if the wind is blowing and the sky clear, then it will go very low; if it is calm, it will go as low as -10, and it will be just as warm as a breeze. The snow is very dry and light. If a fall of snow comes and no wind, when it clears off the month of March comes, the days begin to get warm, the snow begins to melt, and in a few days the prairie is bare and open in a short time the soil dries on top and the farmers start to seed. The seeding generally starts here about the first of April, although last spring was about the latest that wheat was sown. There was no wheat sown last spring, till the first of May, and then the wheat is the first grain that is put in. Last spring was a very beautiful one, no wind nor dust, and every farmer made good use of the time, when the good weather came. The soil is black, the prairie is green in the month of June and July were the months of showery. The hay crop was good—every farmer has all the grain he wants for his stock. The grain crop was a very fair crop, not as good as last year, but a better one. Last year and this year there was no frost to hurt the grain. The frost frosts the wheat and that lowers the price. At present wheat is worth from 47 to 50 cents per bushel, on the Boissavane market. The threshing is nearly all done and some are preparing for the cold weather in the near future. Manitoba and the North-West are well adapted for ranching purposes. There are herds here that contain from two to five hundred head of cattle and horses, and there is one, and sometimes two, men on horse back riding around the cattle. Manitoba is a very good place for game, such as wild geese, ducks, prairie chickens, and other feathered game, too numerous to mention. W. PLUNKETT.

W. C. T. U. CONVENTION.

A report of the Leeds County W. C. T. U. convention, held at Ganantago on the 18th ult., was kindly sent to us last Thursday by the corresponding secretary. The meeting opened on Oct. 18th with Miss Stone, of Athens, presiding, in the absence of the president, Mrs. Cowan. After singing by the convention and prayer by Mrs. Blanchard, an address of welcome was delivered by Mrs. S. Davis, which was responded to by Mrs. Elliott, of Athens. Mrs. H. D. Haiz, of Lansdowne, and Mrs. A. H. Brown, of Brockville, sang a duet, followed by Mrs. Wm. Mott, of Athens, who spoke on the subject of narcotics. Miss Jennie Davis gave a recitation, "Let us Alone," and Miss Edith Giles, of Brockville, an essay on "Cause of indifference of children of temperate and religious parents."

Rev. Mr. Greecy concluded the program of the session with an address on the present aspect of the prohibition question.

Thursday morning was devoted to appointing committees and receiving reports of the corresponding secretary. In the afternoon reports were read from the local unions, and superintendents of departments, after which the officers for the ensuing year were elected, as follows:—

MISSION WORK IN CHINA.

Seoul, Korea, Sept. 18, '93. Editor Athens Reporter.

DEAR SIR,—We have just had our annual meeting and each one is appointed to his work for another year. What experiences the past year has brought! Trials, persecutions, dangers, without—perfect peace within. During a wonderful Saviour is ours! During April and May, soldiers raged our houses night and day. We know not what would befall us, but the dear Master protected us so nothing has harmed us. God's mercies have been new every morning and fresh every evening. During the past year three of my beloved brethren with whom I labored in New York, reaching down after lost ones in the slams, have gone from the mission field to their reward. Bro. Playley and Coot have fallen in the dark continent, Africa, and Dr. Goldburg, in China. They gladly yielded their lives to God, and when the call came to go home, they were ready. They now rest from their labors and their works do follow them. Eight years ago our church commenced work here. Up to last year, had been done outside the treaty ports. Occasional visits had been made into the interior, but no one has been especially appointed to that work. Last year, at our annual meeting, I was in the first instance appointed to exclusive work in the interior of Korea. I praise God for the privilege. Again, this year, I am appointed to the same work. How vastly different it is from our work in the ports, where we have comfortable homes with dear fellow laborers. It is not the dangers, hardships or privations of a missionary life which are hard to bear; it is separation from friends, far away from those whose hearts beat in unison with ours, as we are obliged to travel alone in the interior. No one to sympathize—our own hearts overflowing with love to those who look upon us with suspicion and give no love in return. What feelings of utter loneliness come over the soul, and our Master's words when He said, "Oh, Jerusalem, Jerusalem, how often I have gathered you as a hen gathers her chickens under her wings, but ye would not." And then the Holy Spirit comes into our souls and fills them to overflowing. He comes nearest when we need Him most. Oh blessed work for Jesus! I would not exchange it for any on earth. He makes the desert to bloom as the rose. As we penetrate this dark kingdom, carrying with us the message of salvation, I am sure we shall have the prayers of thousands of warm Christian hearts in the home land. I told you of our little room in square in Pyong Yang, with its mud walls and floor, in which I ate, slept, and treated my patients. On my return to Seoul, at the children's meeting, I told about our work and how much we needed a better house in which to do this work for Jesus. The children said, "Well, Dr. Hall, I shall never forget those prayers, they went straight to the throne of God and soon the answer came. After the meeting closed, Bertie Ohlinger came to my room with a bright silver dollar to help buy a house in Pyong Yang. I wish I could give more, but it is all I have." At Xmas he had received two dollars, with one he bought a present for his mother, the other he gave to God. Next came Wila, his sister, a dot little girl of nine years, with ten cents. Following her came Agnesa Scranton with fifty cents, saying, "I was saving it to buy a piano, but I would rather help with God's work." It was only one dollar and sixty cents and the prayers of God's little ones, but He who fed the five thousand with five loaves of bread and two fishes has multiplied the children's gifts until they have grown in eight months to one thousand four hundred seventy-nine dollars and ninety-nine cents. To-day, we have our building for hospital and dispensary well situated in Pyong Yang. God has since taken Bertie and Wila home to Heaven but still their work goes on. We wish to express our gratitude to the many dear friends in America and a few of the deep interest they are making in our work for the Master. We are looking to God for great blessing.
