LANSLOWNE.
A Brief Description of the Village of Lansdowne and its Surroundings.

Representative of the Reporter spent Friday and Saturday of last week in the village of Lansdowne. He was so favorably impressed with the business activity and thrift of that stirring little borough that he spent a short time in gathering a few notes for the benefit of readers of the Reporter. The village of Lansdowne is situated on the Grand Trunk Railway, about midway between Malton and Gananoque, and is said to have a population of between 400 and 500. The ground upon which the village is built is slightly undulating, making it very easy to have excellent drainage. While there are no very large and imposing blocks, the buildings are well and substantially built and adapted to the business for which they are intended. The township hall, a massive stone building, is built on the highest elevation in the village and shows off to good advantage. The building is nearly square, two stories and a basement in height. The third, or top story, is used as a lodge room by the I. O. O. F., and is well furnished. A raised dais, about 5 feet high, extends around the whole length of the room, nicely carpeted and furnished with canopy seats, and is in the chief officer. The I. O. O. F. are in membership and good financial standing. The ground floor is used as a council chamber and general business hall of the municipality, and is well fitted with comfortable folding chairs. In the basement, the furnace for heating the entire building is situated. The furnace first placed in position was found too small to furnish the required heat and will be taken out and replaced with one of larger capacity. Inquiries elicited the information that there are at present six general stores, two groceries, one linens, one bakery, three blacksmith shops, two carriage shops, two merchant tailors, one harness maker, two shoe shops, two telephone and telegraph offices, a steam saw and planer mill, one livery stable, one barber shop, one coal and lumber yard, two cattle dealers, etc. The spiritual welfare of the community is looked after by the Methodist, English, and Presbyterian bodies who each have large and handsome churches. Secret societies are represented by the Masons, Odd-fellows, Orangemen, Foresters, Chosen Friends and Sons of Temperance. A well disciplined brass band, under the leadership of Prof. Wood, are ever ready to entertain the public. Two doctors minister to the bodily ailments of those requiring their services, while the wants of the inner man are well looked after at the Stewart House, a large and well patronized hostelry, very conveniently located. Lansdowne village is situated in the center of one of the best agricultural districts in Ontario. The soil is of the best, the tillers of the soil are among the most intelligent and thrifty to be found anywhere, and the well kept roads, the well cultivated fields, the neat and comfortable farm houses and buildings, all testify that the country surrounding Lansdowne village is one of the best farming sections to be found anywhere in Canada. As is common in all progressive communities, the agricultural buildings and buildings are within the village limits and the annual fair adds a little to the gross revenue of the place.
