AN ARMISTICE POSSIBLE

Japan Announces Its Willingness to Negotiate for Peace.

MARCHING UPON WEI-HAI-WEI
This stronghold the West Point of Attack—The Chinese Generals in Command at Fort Arthur in Danger of Losing Their Heads for Their Treachery.

TOPICS OF A WEEK
The Important Events in a Few Words For Busy Readers.

London, Dec. 3.—The Chinese-Foo correspondent of the Central News says: The prevalent impression is that the Japanese will abandon the matter on Pekin. Part of the Japanese fleet has been seen in the Gulf of Wei-Hai-Wei, but it has made no attack. It is reported that an army of 200,000 Chinese expects to intercept the Japanese on their march toward Cheung.

CANADA IN THE PANIC

Advantages of Our Banking System as Seen by an American.
New York, Dec. 1.—The Post has the following editorial: "Mr. W. C. Cornwall, of Buffalo, furnishes to Bradstreet's an article on the experience of Canada during our panic of last year. In the first place Canada had no panic because she had no cause of panic. She had no Sherman silver law in operation, pouring millions of treasury and bank notes into circulation whether they were wanted or not. The banks and not the government supplied the currency of the country. It was wanted, and redeemed it when it was not wanted.

IN REPLY TO GARDNER

Sir Charles Tupper Again Denies the Existence of Pleuro-Pneumonia.

London, Dec. 1.—Sir Charles Tupper, Canadian High Commissioner, has published a reply to Mr. Herbert Gardner's statement in behalf of the government, concerning pleuro-pneumonia in Canada. He says:

"The offer of Canada to pay the expenses of an inquiry by veterinary surgeons is made without any ulterior question as to the cost or the result. I challenge the Board of Agriculture to deny that if any of the alleged cases since 1890 had this pleuro-pneumonia, the disease must have appeared in many parts of Canada, and not only in the West Indies. The disease found among animals arriving in England was unknown in Canada and was due to the conditions of transit. Hence it is called transit pneumonia."

In conclusion, Sir Charles writes: "The Canadian Government feels aggrieved that the representation already made in London, and the information sent, proving that Canada is free from pleuro-pneumonia, has not led to the removal of the restrictions."

Case to be Tried for Manslaughter.

GUERLON, Ont., Nov. 30.—The coroner's jury who has been sitting on the Johnson alleged murder case over eight days, Saturday, has brought in a verdict of manslaughter against Cass, and Keating is held as an accessory.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.—The condition of Bahan, the captain of the Georgetown college football club, who was so seriously injured in the game with the Columbia Athletic Club on Thanksgiving day, remains about the same. His spine is fractured, and he will be unable to play for some time.

A Charity Hospital Destroyed.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Dec. 2.—The charity hospital, a magnificent structure, erected at a cost of about \$200,000, was discovered to be in flames, and owing to its situation outside the city limits was totally destroyed. There was no fatalities as the inmates succeeded in getting out. The fire was the work of an incendiary.

Won the Walking Wage.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 2.—Mr. M. Report who left New York City last week, on a wage of \$5,000 that he would receive in San Francisco on or before December 1, walks the entire distance without spending a cent other than what he earned on the journey, arrived here with six hours to spare.

Montreal Police Investigation.

MONTREAL, Dec. 1.—The investigation into the robbery of the Montreal Police force was continued yesterday. Chief Detective Collins made the progress of the case very satisfactory. The Montreal force had received letters from keepers of disorderly houses, but had been reduced from the ranks in consequence.
