Christmas exchange gifts were distributed to each member. After the Lord's Prayer and Grace were said, all joined in with a potluck of festivities.



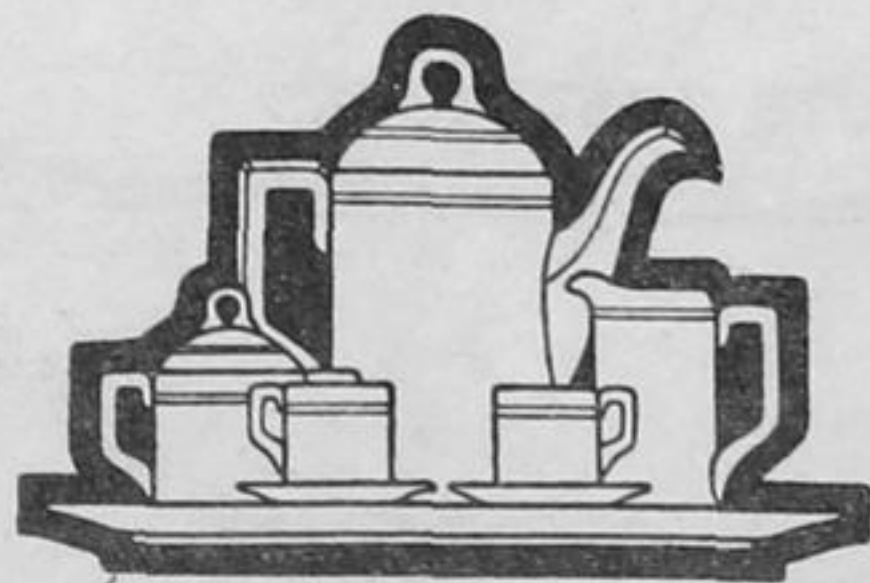
