
SEELEY'S BAY SENIORS



Services of a dog catcher are available by telephoning the Township Office (928-2423). Impounded dogs are placed in Riverdale Kennels near Athens and certain fees are charged upon redemption. Licences may be purchased at the Township office, or you may mail in this form, with your cheque or money order, payable to the Township, to:

The fee, set by By-law 2-1984, is FIVE DOLLARS AND TWENTY-FIVE CENTS (\$5.25) for EVERY DOG, male, female, spayed or neutred.
