OLIVET U.C.W.

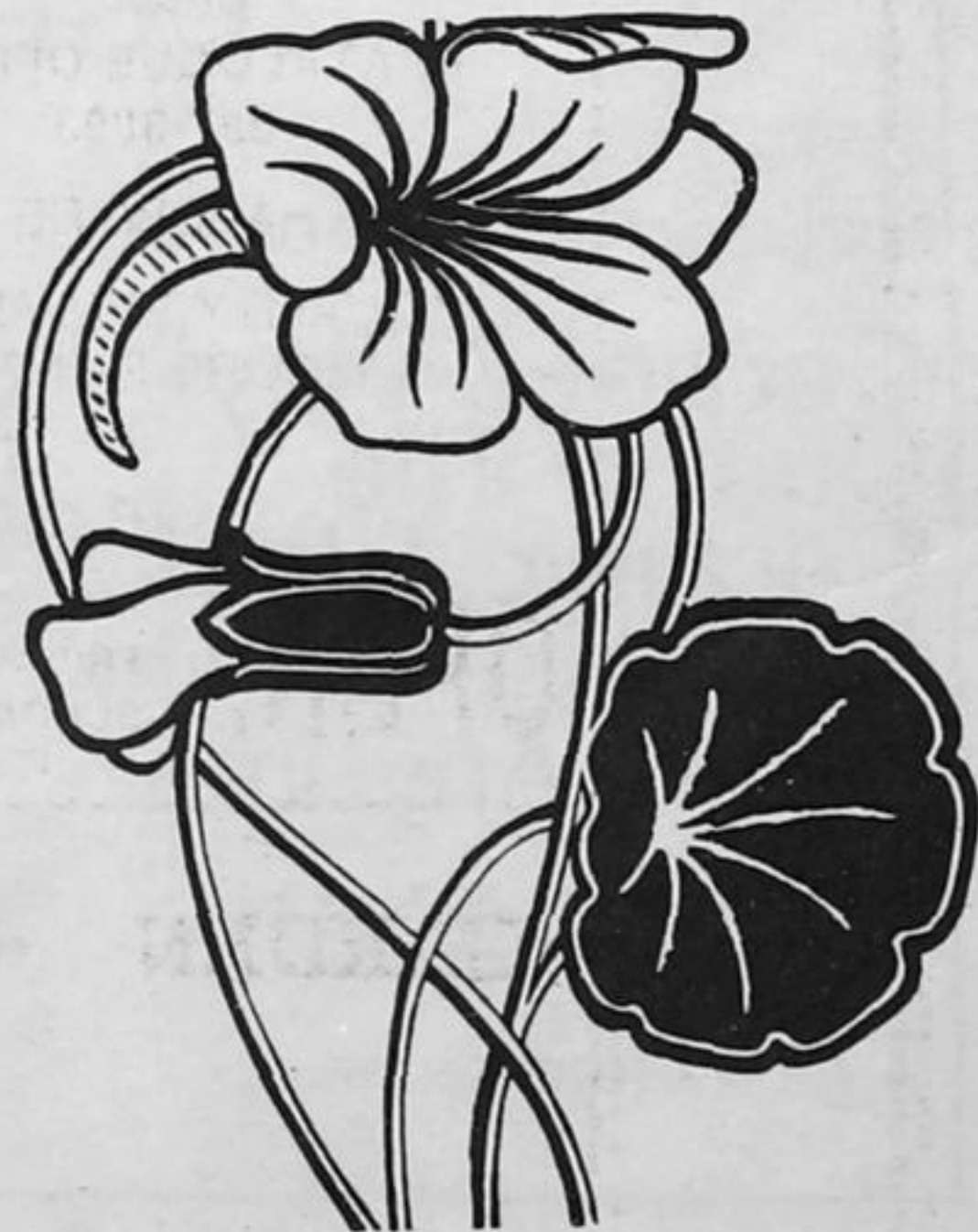
