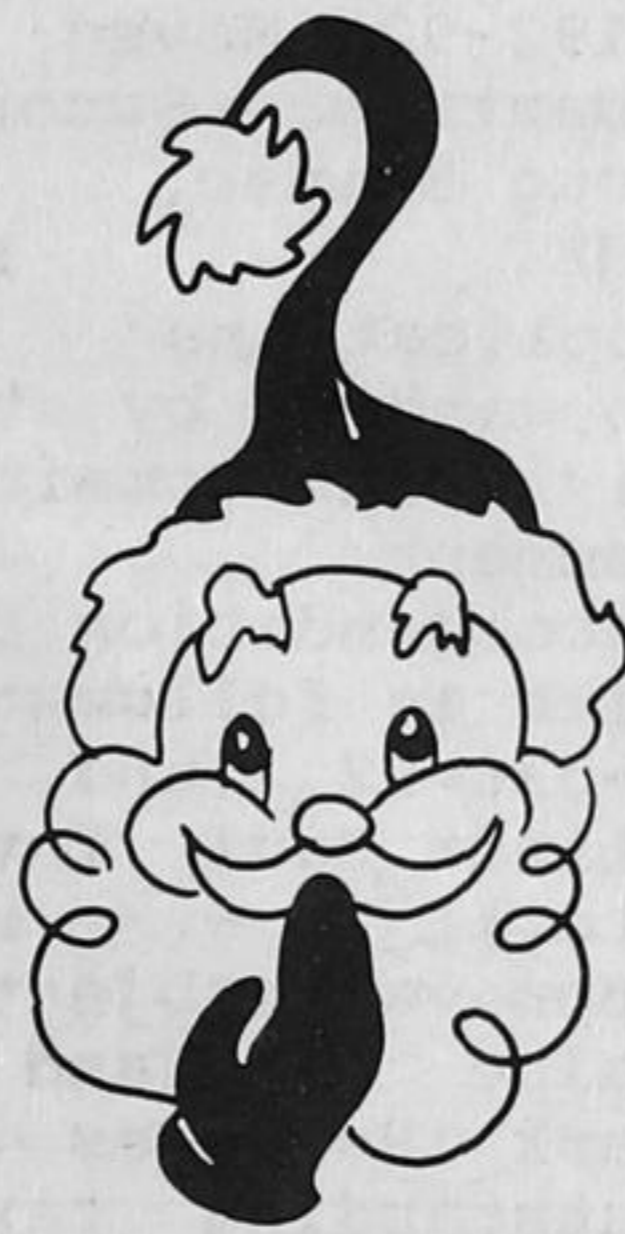

1993 DOG LICENCES

In this Township ALL DOGS, 6 months and older, must by By-Law be licenced. Licences are available and due JANUARY 1, 1993 each year. DOGS ARE NOT TO RUN AT LARGE. Services of a dog catcher are available by telephoning the Municipal Office 928-2423. Impounded dogs are placed in Riverdale Kennels near Athens and certain fees are charged upon redemption. Licences may be purchased at the Municipal Office or by mail using the attached form, payable to the Township Rear of Leeds and Lansdowne, Box 160, Lyndhurst, Ontario, K0E 1N0.

The fee, set by By-Law 20-1990, is SEVEN DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS (\$7.50) for every dog, male, female, spayed or neutred. Dog licences are exempt from GST.

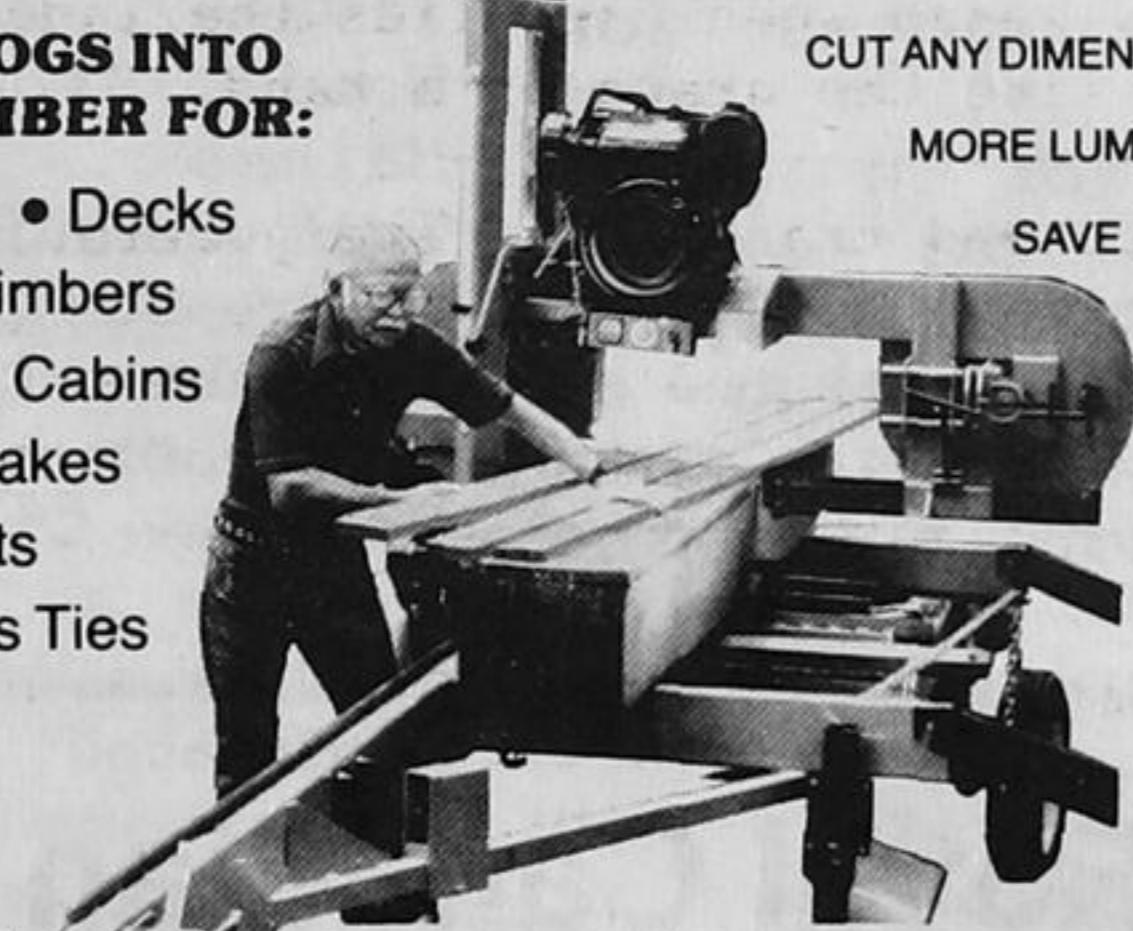
