Enclosed with your tax bill is the 1991 "green" pass book for entrance to our waste disposal sites. Beginning April 1, 1991 the pink pass book will be no longer vaild.

There have been two new regulations for

a) Those depositing renovation and building debris (e.g. shingles, wallboard, used lumber, cement building debris etc) must have a permit and pay the licenced hauler rate (this includes \{ ton truck, vans, trailers) minimum fee \$12.00

b) A surcharge of \$2.00 each to be levied for tires.

Please read your booklet for all information pertaining to the waste site regulations and hours of operation.
