And see that the men's club is fed.*

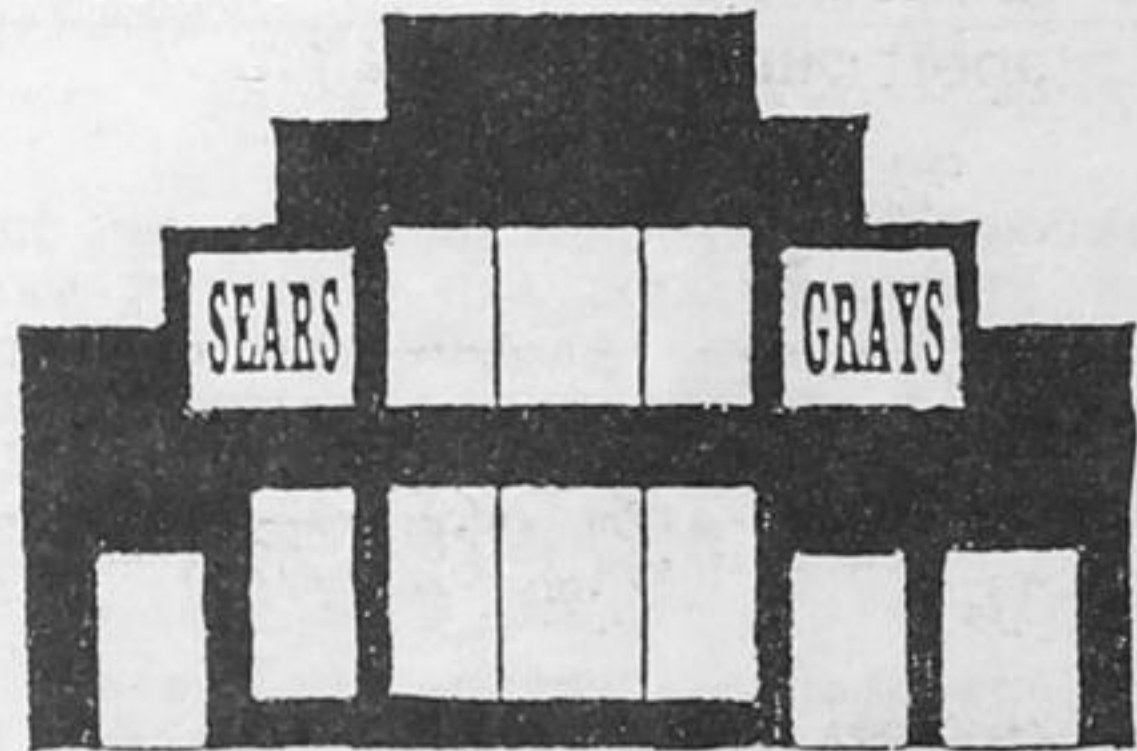
*The money we raise isn't peanuts
