The Council of the Township of South Crosby met on August 6, 1991, all members present. Minutes from the following meetings were read and approved: July 15, 22, 1991.

John Fleming and Everton Strong, Construction Committee for the South Crosby NonProfit Housing Corporation attended Council Meeting, to discuss the access road to the Non-Profit Housing Project. Mr. Fleming gave a verbal summary on the progress to date. Discussion was also held concerning insurance coverage during construction of the buildings, and it was indicated that the contractor has such coverage. Discussion was held concerning proposal that Township of South Crosby assume the roadway within proposed development.

Council agree to waive the Building Permit fee, in relation to the construction of the Non-Profit Housing Corporation project (Pine View Apartments).

Derek Turnbull, Chief Building Official/Zoning Administrator attended Council Meeting.

Deputy-Reeve Wayne Sly asked if Mr. Turnbull was aware of the septic system on property owned by Mr. David Ross. Mr Turnbull advised that the system was approved by the Department of Health. Council agreed that Martin Moir, Department of Health, Smiths Falls, Ontario be invited to attend the Council Meeting on Monday, August 19, 1991, to discuss approval given to septic system on property owned by Mr. David Ross.

Approved Road Voucher No. 14, in the amount of \$14,976.84 for payment. Council agreed that G. Tackaberry Construction be engaged to overlay

the existing parking lot at the Municipal Office, with the costs being shared on a fifty/fifty basis by the Road Department and the General Office.

Mainstay: For The Well Spouse Of The Chronically Ill

Maggie Strong's story is the story of any well spouse. It is an account of anger, frustration, confusion, helplessness, guilt, abandonment. It is also a chronicle of courage, support, hope and love. Her insights into life with the chronically ill are sad, humourous, helpful and hardhitting. While writing of the many crises she and the family have lived through she avoids wallowing in selfpity. Indeed, her message is about getting on with life and making the best of a difficult situation.

MAINSTAY is worth reading whether you are the spouse, family, or acquaintance of an individual suffering from some form of chronic illness, or the physician of any of the aforementioned.

This compassionate, personal account is interspersed with stories of other spouses, practical suggestions and analysis from various authorities.

If you are a well spouse,

you will doubtless identify with some, if not all, of the concerns experienced by Strong in her account of the progress of her husband's illness and how it affects their lives. For those having difficulty coping with problems resulting from a chronic illness, Strong has many suggestions arising from personal experience (her own and others) and also gleaned from professionals. An address for contacting a Well Spouse support group is included. Family and friends of the well spouse should read this for insight into what they can be doing to support the family.

This should definitely be required reading for all health care professionals, particularly physicians who discount the concerns of well spouses or view them as hysteria.

REGISTRATION OF CANDIDATES - 1991 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

It is MANDATORY that every person who proposes to be a candidate (Reeve, Deputy-Reeve, Councillor, Police Village Trustee) for the Township of South Crosby MUST register with the Municipal Clerk on or before NOMINATION DAY, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 11th, 1991.

The Notice of Registration must be completed and filed with the Clerk. Forms are available during regular office hours at the Township of South Crosby, Municipal Office.

The Municipal Election Act requires that any person who proposes to be a candidate for any office may not solicit or accept contributions for election purposes or incur campaign expenses until they have filed notice of registration with the Municipal Clerk responsible for the conduct of the election.

Registration may be made at the Municipal Office during normal working hours or you may do so by registered mail to the Clerk.
