Your Board has three groups past three years: of members, all unpaid:

Trustees: Three trustees are elected every three years at municipal election time. As described in the Municipal new septic system. The Act, to be nominated, a candidate must either reside in Ward (Portland), or own a business here, and have the support of ten other electors (residents);

Community Representatives: Six community representatives elected each year at the Annual Meeting of your Community Board. A person must be a resident or a business owner, and nominated by the trustees.

3. Group Representatives: number of community organizations, including the Anglican and United Churches, the Rideau Welcome Club, the Legion, Firefighters' the Association, and the Rideau Lakes Union Library Board members place on the Community Board. In each case these people are selected by their organizations.
