Council Meeting - November 4, 1991

- Approved payment of General Account - \$4,766.71; Fire Department - \$1,015.78; Park Department - \$307.16; Waste Disposal \$3,031.35; Planning - \$3,398.98; Road Department - \$20,257.36.
- Accept the proposal of a Developer to pay 5% in cash in lieu of the 5% Land dedication for Park Purposes.
- Approved Severance B-735-89, on signing of the long-term lease for mainland parking.
- Approved Severance B-537-91.
- Authorized the Road Superintendent to apply for an Interim Road Subsidy in the amount of \$530,230.74.
- Passed two by-laws "Restricting the Weight of Vehicles Passing Over A Bridge".
- Passed a by-law "Accept Certain Lands for Public purposes and Dedicate them as a Public Highway".
- Arranged an on-site meeting with Cataraqui Conservation Authority personnel and Council in regards to severances B736-89; B-737-89.
- Approved renewal lease for Lot 13, Concession 2, South Burgess for a 5 year term. (Willis Wharf).
- Inform Township of Augusta we are unable to accept waste material from outside the municipality.
- Request Fire Chief Paul Ostrom to meet with Road Superintendent and County Engineer, to make arrangements for fire access to load water, at Bullard's Bridge and Bonger's Bridge.
- Authorized the Clerk-Treasurer to contact our Solicitor in regards to property being placed in Tax Sale.
- Executed an Agreement amending our Lease for the Government Dock, Portland.
- Invested the Clergy Reserve Fund for a one year term.
- Authorized the Clerk-Treasurer to make application for a W.M.I.P. Grant from the Ministry of Environment for the year 1992/93.
- Request the Village Trustees, Delta, to meet with Council in regards to snow-plowing sidewalks in the Village.
- Members of Council to

- answer a letter from a ratepayer - meeting date Nov.7/91.
- Requested a Statement of cost of the Building Department computer system and an up-date on the progress of information available.
- Adjourn to meet November 18, 1991 at 6:00 P.M.

NOVEMBER 18, 1991

- Approved payment of General Voucher \$9,560.58; Fire Department \$1,934.65; Park Department \$1,235.82; Waste Disposal Department \$1,750.95; Recreation Department \$408.00; Planning Department \$109.00;
- Council sit as a Committee of Adjustment.
- Passed a by-law "To Permit Retail Business Establishments to be open on any Holiday".
- Authorized Fire Chief Paul Ostrom to purchase a used water tank truck.
- Authorized the Zoning Administrator to prepare amendments for the Official Plan and Zoning By-Law, to allow a Subdivision proposal to proceed.
- Approve Severance B-578-91.
- Requested a further meeting with the Delta Village Trustees in regards to plowing sidewalks.
- Inform property owners along Concession 3 & 4, Lots 24 & 25, co-operation is essential in maintaining closed gates or entranceways.
- Passed a by-law "To Execute an Agreement with a Commercial Property Owner"
- Acknowledge correspondence from a ratepayer concerning the work done on St. Mary's Street, Portland, stating "all avenues are being pursued through the proper channels".
- Endorse in principle the resolution from South Elmsley.
- Granted a bonus to a Township employee for services rendered during the absence of another employee.
- Adopt the minutes of the November 18, 1991 meeting as if read.
- Adjourned - Inaugural Meeting of New Council - December 2, 1991 at 11:00 A.M. The Public is invited to attend.

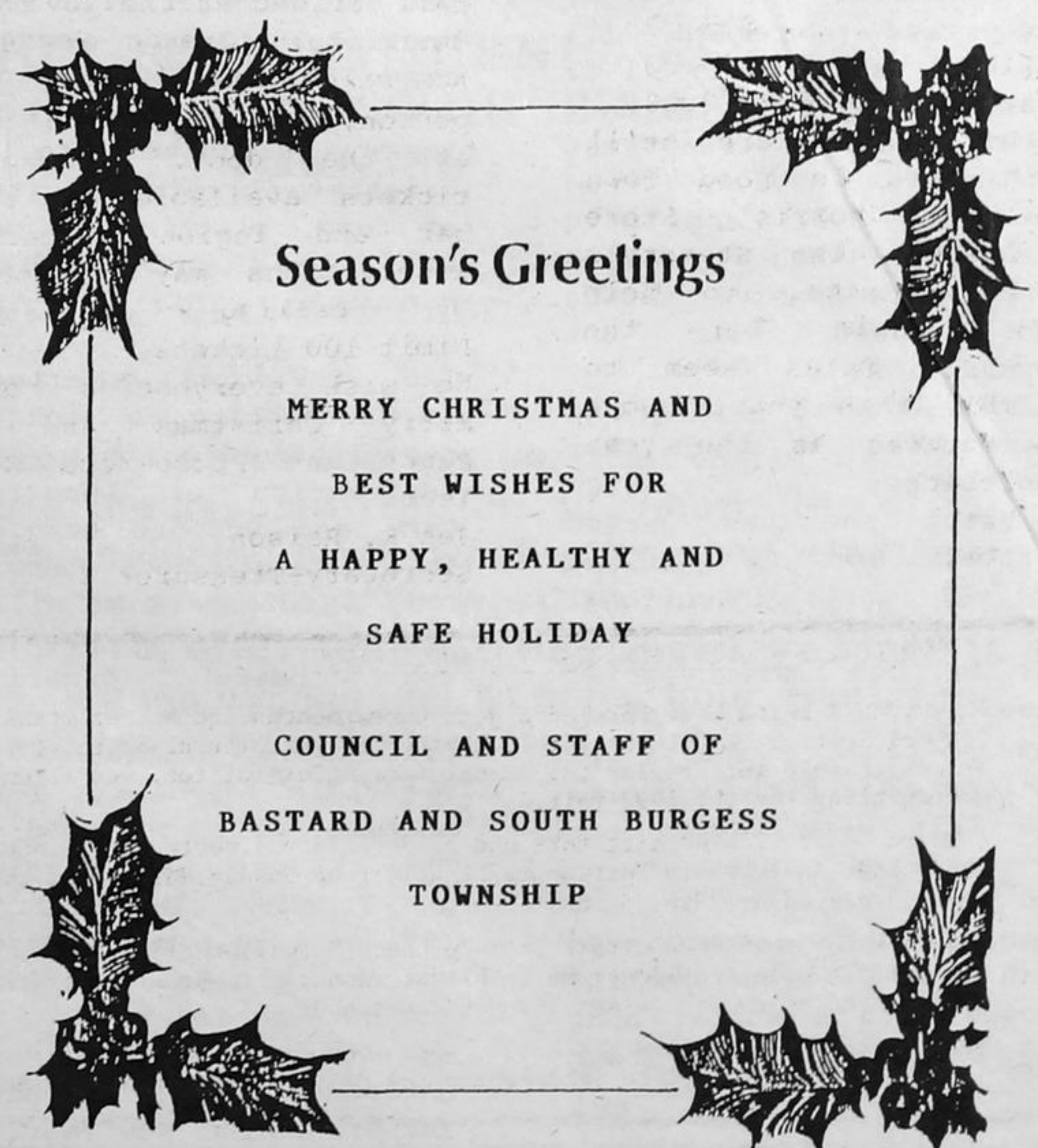
Each student received a Smoke Detector and a
