Wind has more Brian Jacques swashbuckling adventures in his Mariel of Redwall, with searat pirates and mouse slaves. Jane Leslie Conly sends Rosco and the Rats of NIMH against computer programmed

to destroy their homes. Beverly cleary continues the adventures of an older Leigh Botts, age 14, still keeping a diary and now accompanied by Strider, his dog. Ann Petry, who introduced Harriet Tubman to thousands of readers, now gives us Titura of Salem Village, a tale of witchcraft set in 1692. Robert Siegel introduced Whale, in Whalesong, continues with Hruna's son Hralekana, a White Whale (among greys) who seeks his place in whale society.

For the much younger reader Hirschi Ron has photographic essay What is a Cat? For Waldo fans, take a gander at Alastair Graham's Full Moon Soup or the Fall of the Hotel Splendide. pipe-smoking she frog the central character in Tololwa M. 
biographical-history, is a joy for both parent and child.
