Re: Prescription Prices

EDID YOU KNOW THAT-

- by law, in Ontario, prescription prices must be printed on the receipt, showing the 'cost price', 'dispensing fee' and total price'

fee', and 'total price'. -the COST PRICE is regulated by the provincial government, and is based on the least expensive approved brand available, in the most economical quantity available. eg. The pharmacist's cost of a drug might be \$20.00 per 100 tablets and \$150.00 per 1000 tablets, i.e. \$15.00 per 100 if you buy 1000 tablets. The pharmacist must charge only = \$15.00 per 100 as the cost price (plus a dispensing fee - where applicable), even - though he might have to buy only in lots of 100 because of a limited demand. Obviously, if the demand for this item = increased sufficiently, the pharmacist might eventually be able to buy the larger size, thereby finally breaking even on the cost, while risking a possible decrease in demand. -the dispensing fee is not

allowed on some types of prescriptions. Several are dispensed at less than \$6.00. -contrary to the opinion of many, the dispensing fee is not 'pure profit' - it must pay for all dispensary expenses, including staff wages, computer, bottles, labels, inventory, insurance, light, -heat, outdated or obsolete inventory, reference books, continuing education, licences, etc, etc. After ALL expenses have been paid, the remainder is profit.

-the dispensing fee must be registered with, and approved by the Ontario College of Pharmacists, and posted in the dispensary.

Obviously prescription prices are extremely well regulated by the Ontario government.
