1991: REVIEW OF BIG RIDEAU LAKE ASSOCIATION RIDEAU RECYCLE AND RESTORATION PROJECT ENVIRONMENTAL PARTNERS FUND

The first year of this three year project proved to be a great success. The cash value amounted to \$7500.00. More important was the significant number of volunteer hours - more than 500, in the following activities:

- plantings of 2000 trees and shrubs along the shoreline
- photo inventory of shoreline erosion - improvement of loon nest sites and construction of
- seven artificial nesting platforms - environmental mailing to 700 lakeshore residents
- public environmental meeting at Rideau Ferry
- clean-up of tornado and forest fire zone
- comprehensive water testing - survey and information package dropped off at 1300 lakeshore properties in support of recycling, composting, wake abatement and other environmental
- objectives - visitation with over 200 lake residents - environmental leaflets designed for day-in boaters distributed at various launching sites on Big and Lower

The above program is organized by the Big Rideau Lake Association, with some funding support from Environment Canada, E.P.F.. In co-operation with relevant government agencies it seeks to enlist partnerships with individuals and other groups that will make visible improvements to our shared lake resources.
