**TRADITIONAL IRISH LEMON PUDDING**

- 1/2 cup butter
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 lemon
- 2 tbsp flour
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 tbsp confectioner's sugar

(Preheat oven to 400 degrees)

Cream butter and sugar till light and fluffy in a bowl. Separate the eggs and add the yolks to the creamed mixture. Beat well. Grate rind from lemon and squeeze out the juice. Beat into the creamed mixture. Gradually stir in the flour, and then the milk. Beat egg whites till stiff, then carefully fold into mixture. Turn into a greased 7 inch souffle dish and sift confectioner's sugar over. Place dish in roasting pan containing 1 inch of hot water. Bake for 40 -50 minutes till the pudding has risen and the top is golden. Serve hot or cold.
