Later, in London, widowed and remarried she hopes to hide the boy's identity. Alexis's brother, a Soviet officer discovers the boy's existence and plans to use him to the future glory of the K.G.B. The story continues with Richard Kent and David Windfield, friends and rivals at Oxford, one follows their lives and joint love of Julia with a nagging suspicion that first one and then the other is the subtly trained traitor. Of course it is possible to guess which one it is, but the outcome is none the less exciting. B.S.S.
