

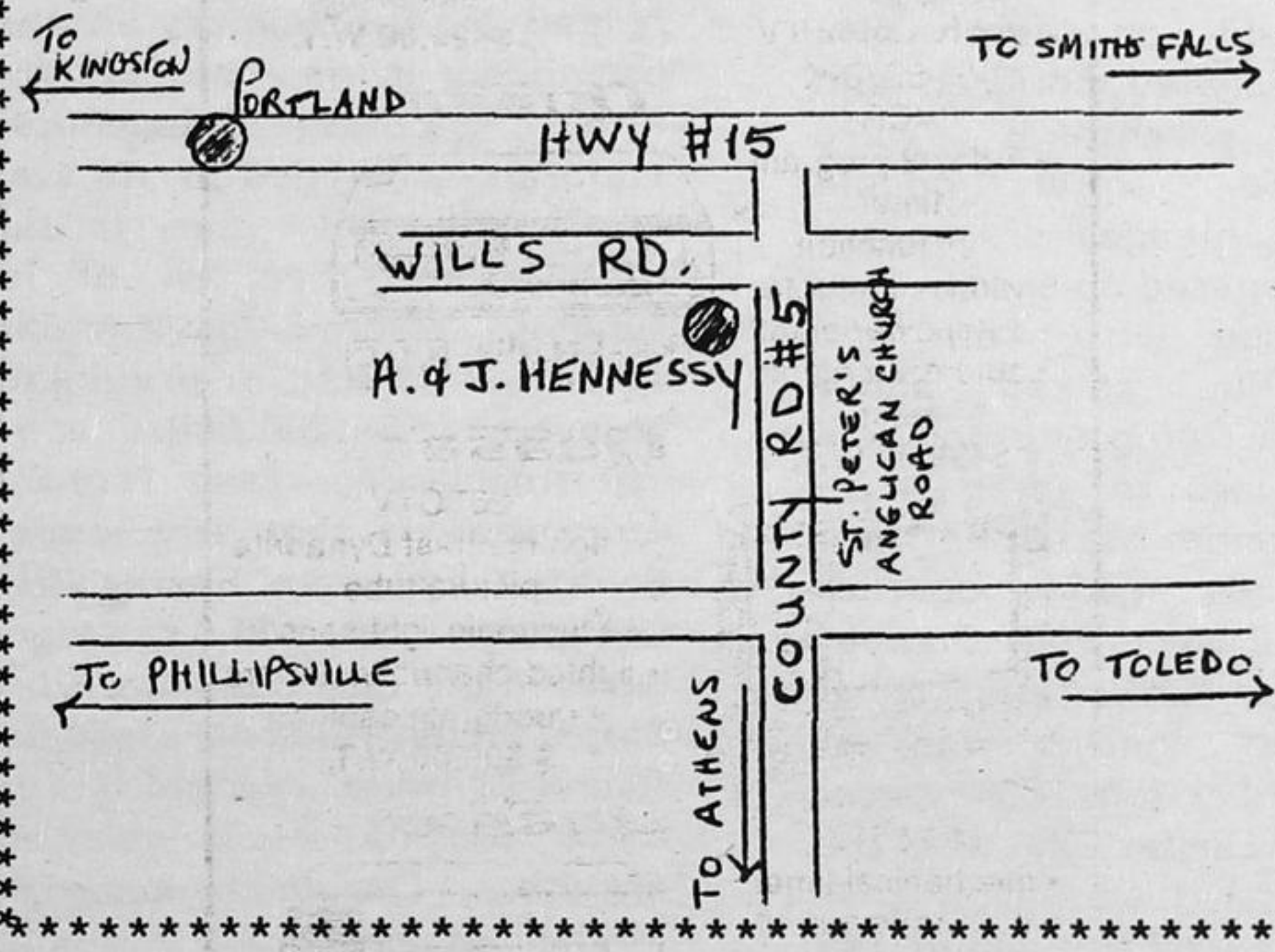

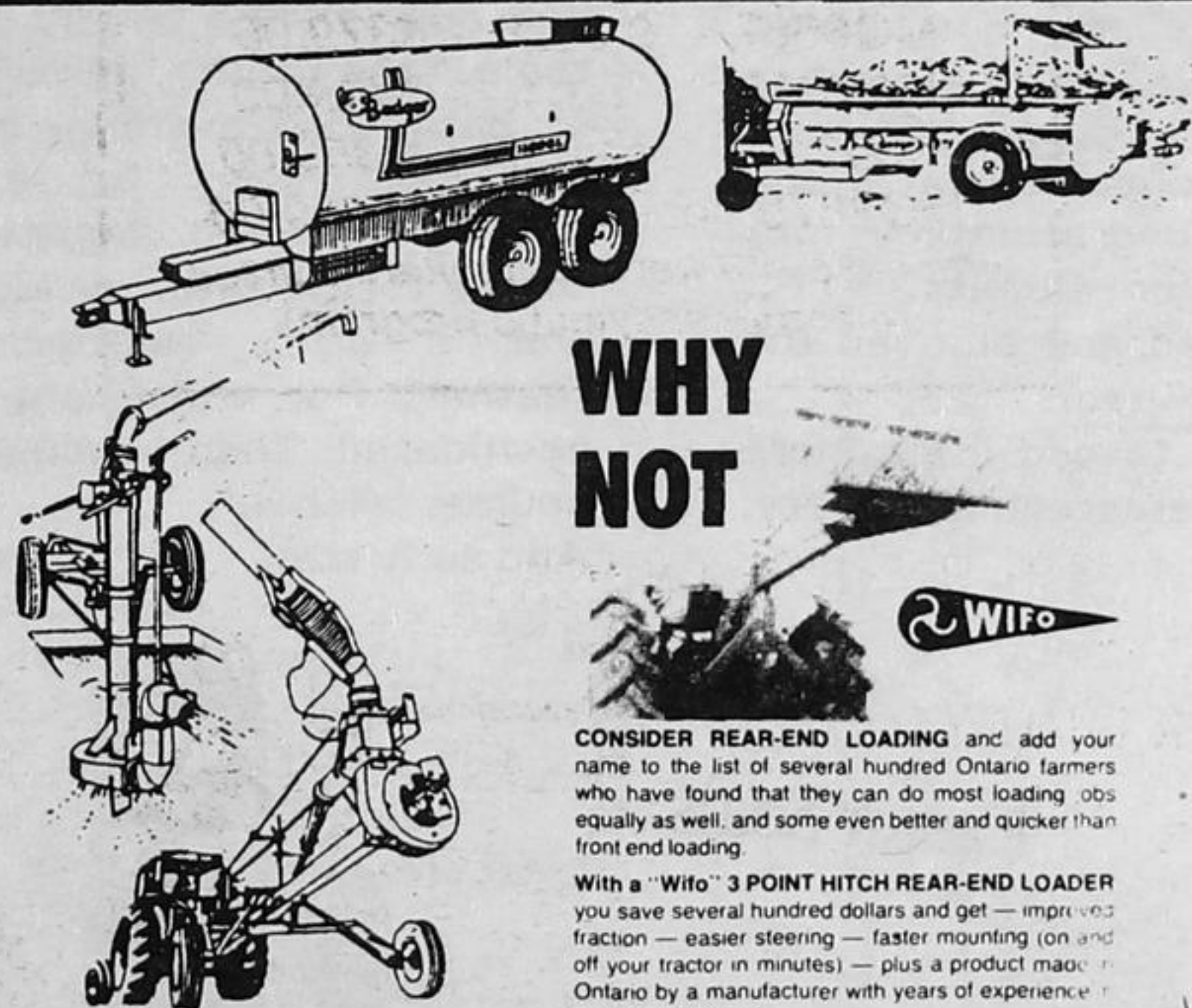
Rideau's community responded magnificently to requests for help to see the boys on their way.

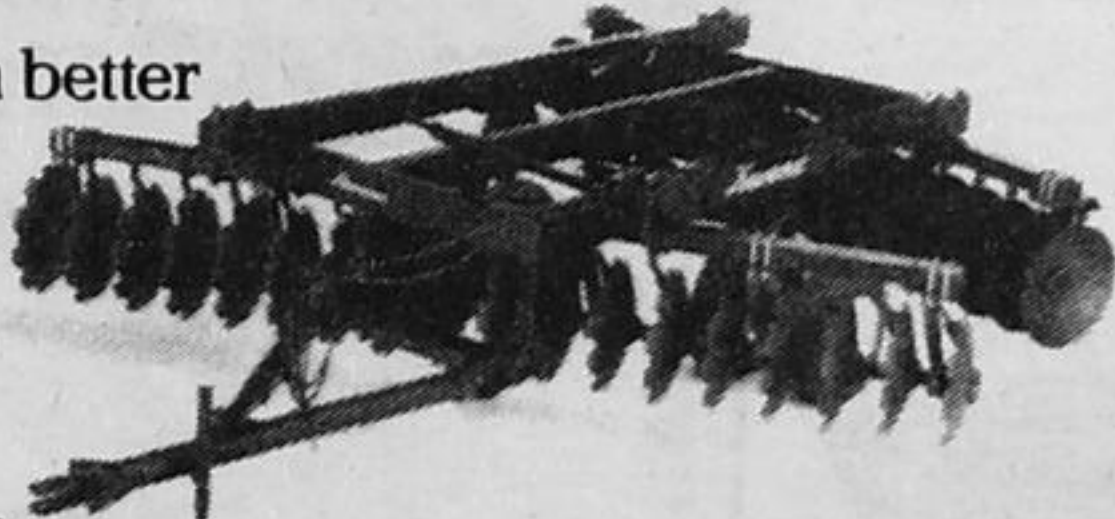
