

**TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH CROSBY**


Council Meeting  
 March 21, 1988  
 Mr. Tony Emprey, Canada Mortgage and Housing Corp. spoke regarding Rural and Native Housing Program  
 Mr. Jim Fairfield, of Thorne, Ernst and Whinney Chartered Accountants presented Council with Financial Statement for 1987.  
 Paid Road Voucher No.5, in the amount of \$5,564.90  
 The Road Superintendent gave his report.  
 A,J,Graham Engineering Consultants have been engaged with regards to a road management study.  
 Paid General Office accounts in the amount of \$140,075.20  
 Committees were appointed for the following:  
 Morton Community Centre  
 Elgin Community Centre  
 Crosby Community Centre  
 Township of South Crosby Recreation Committee  
 By-Law No. 11-88 was read first, second and third times and passed.  
 Meeting adjourned  
 Council meeting April 5th, 1988  
 Passed a motion that the Zoning Administrator is authorized to proceed with zoning change, as requested by Mr. J. Hawkins  
 Council were advised that Dawn Smith has been appointed as a member to LAC 64, that the Township of South Crosby is one of the designated areas that might opt for community futures funding and that Mr. David Gatehouse will be contacting our municipal office regarding this program.  
 Paid Road Voucher No.6, in the amount of \$9,168.74.  
 Road Superintendent gave his report.  
 Motion to authorize purchase of a brush chipper if demonstration proves it to meet requirements.  
 Discussion was held regarding repairs to roof and eavestroughs at the library.  
 Road Superintendent is to make arrangements for installation of, or repairs to, the eavestroughs, and report on the roof.  
 Motion passed to pay general office accounts, in the amount of \$5,666.35.  
 By-Law No. 12-88 was read three times and passed.  
 By-Law No. 13-88 was read three times and passed.  
 A motion was passed that in 1988 the Chaffey's Lock and Area Heritage Society be given \$5,046.00 which sum includes the following: \$546.00 operating grant for the Lockmaster's Museum, a 5% increase, and \$4,500.00 a special project grant for the preservation and display of South Crosby Historical records in 1988.  
 Meeting adjourned.

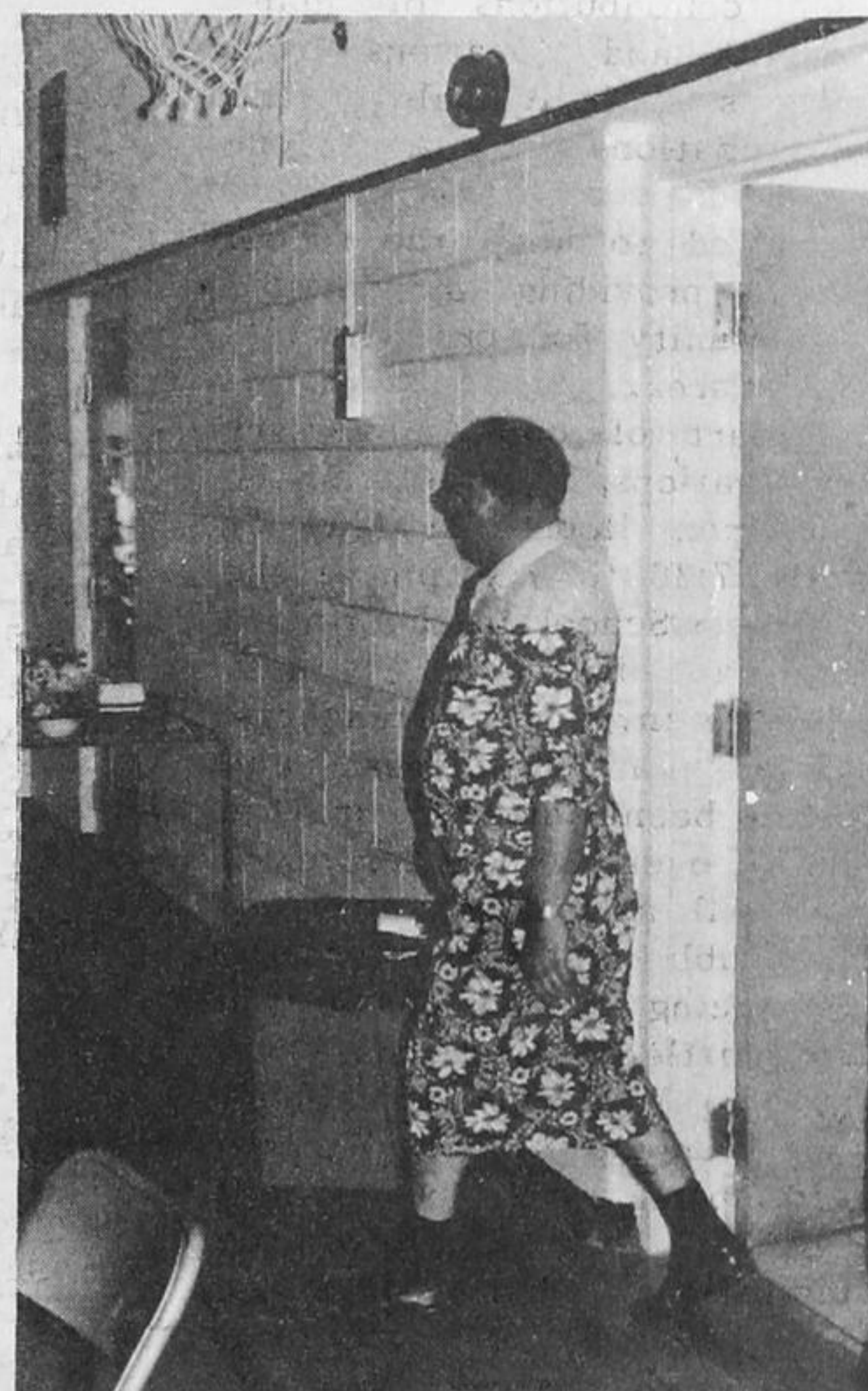
