We're still travelling! On Nov. 4, Reeve Ostrom, Councillors P. Tackaberry and A. Greenhorn, Clerk-Treasurer S. Bryden and Deputy Clerk-Treasurer, J. Purdie attended a seminar in Brockville on the Pay Equity Act. Bill 154 is to be proclaimed in the near future and Municipal councils are responsible for implementation. Statistics show that working women are paid 63 cents for every dollar paid to a male employee. Differences in education, experience and number of working hours explain some of the gap, but up to one half of it is due to women's work being undervalued. Within two years of the bill's proclamation your Municipal along with council its counterparts must revise its payroll to bring female employees on par with men doing comparable skills, effort, responsibility and working conditions. It was pointed out that responsibilities and experience required to do a clerk/administrator job comparable to rougher working conditions faced by a male worker. Using a point system a stenographer actually scored 5 points above a road crew worker. Organizations must be able to clearly demonstrate to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs that job rankings reflect an unbiased evaluation of each job against the four facts mentioned above. Under the act some male but all female job classes have to be identified and compared. The Association of Municipalities of Ontario is offering pay equity consulting services starting at \$2,000.00. Hopefully, we'll be able to tackle the job ourselves - so it looks like a busy New Year.

At the Nov. 16 meeting, Ron Smith,

Polar Power Lines, attended upon Council to apprise it of th difficulties his company experienced in the past year as well as idiosyncransies of the street light system. Unfortunately the Smiths' new home was destroyed by fire the day before they were to move into it. This has necessitated both family and office operating from a mobile home with all the attendant difficulties.

Have you encountered one of those street lights which refuses to come on until after you've called the repairman? Well , you're not alone! At this time of year when the temperature drops below freezing at night and rises rapidly the daytime, condensation tends to accumulate in the photo control. Hence the moisture freezes, preventing the control from operating the light. A quick trip up the pole remedies this.but does not prevent a reoccurrance. This is not to suggest you climb the pole! Constant cold or constant above freezing temperatures cause no problem.

Patrols are carried out at night on a regular basis and a check is made the night prior Hallowe'en. We finally found a group of workers which welcomes the longer period of darkness. These patrols can be started at 5:00 pm, thus ensuring an earlier bedtime than in the summer months.

If there is a complaint about defective light, it must be routed through your Municipal Office.
