The OPP R.I.D.E. program is a year-round anti-impaired driving campaign, stepped up for eight weeks during the peak of the festive season.

The two-week extension Christmas/New R.I.D.E. blitz, Year which ran for only six to last weeks prior has year's program, effective proved screening twice as many motorists, and getting hundreds impaired of drivers and liquor law violators off the roads.

Impaired driving is still the of most one significant factors in approximately half of all vehicle fatal motor accidents investigated by OPP the OPP. "The R.I.D.E. program is an essential means reducing the risk of accidents and fatalities on our highways at any time of the year," said OPP Commissioner Archie Ferguson. "The potential danger has for traditionally increased the Christmas during and for this season, the OPP will reason place a high priority on taking impaired drivers off the road," the Commissioner added.

In last year's Christmas/New Year OPP R.I.D.E. blitz, officers checked 357,167 drivers the across charged and province 1,193 people with alcohol-related Criminal Code of Canada driving offences. A total of 2,938 motorists were taken off the road with 12-hour licence suspensions and 1,595 people faced Liquor Licence Act charges for having alcohol easily accessible to the driver. The OPP will operate a minimum of 40 R.I.D.E. check locations across Ontario day, every than stopping more 20,000 vehicles weekly.

All available manpower, aided by auxiliary members, will be committed to the R.I.D.E. program during the two-month Christmas/New Year blitz.

R.I.D.E. OPP "The checks may inconvenience the motoring public, but we will keep the delays down to a minimum," Commissioner said "Our main Ferguson. purpose is to save lives and prevent accidents and it is in everyone's that we interest best stop impaired driving," Commissioner said

Ferguson. Westport OPP Detachment will also actively be the involved in R.I.D.E. Province-wide program. There has been a special squad selected surrounding from Detachments to provide checks. The roadside constables assigned to this squad will augment Detachment normal duties, should the need arise. They will be fully equipped with roadside devices, screening known commonly check ALERTS, to any driver who has been driver drinking. A "Fail" registering a response on the ALERT will be arrested and taken to a breathalyzer for a final breath test. It should also be noted that the special squad will not be the only conducting officers checks. All roadside surrounding Detachments will be setting up their own roadside checks at locations various and duties manpower permit. Please keep in mind that when you or your group apply for a Special Occasion Permit from the Liquor Licence Board, a copy of this is sent to the local Police office to make the officers aware of the location and number of people expected to attend.
