Ministry The Environment (M.O.E.) is committed to assisting municipalities which wish to recycle waste such as glass, cardboard, metal, wood, plastic, tires, wiring. and paper, Recycling is taking place in 40 municipalities but in smaller municipalities there are problems in regard to costs (lower volume-higher costs) of separation, storage, labour, and the purchase of collection equipment. It was pointed out that

at all locations. problem areas Other under came which discussion were funding landfill studies, rock geology, sites, formations, problems for leaking, ground water pollution, burning vs. markets for burying, sale of recycled items, clear governmental policies, uniformity of making, decision production of energy from garbage (heat, electricity), planning, social political, and economic pressures and of course the N.I.M.B.Y. syndrome, (not in my back yard). and it was said that garbage is something that everyone wants picked up but no set down wants again.

Discussed as well were Waste Management Master Plans, Waste Management Improvement Program, Environmental the Protection Act, and proposed amendments to it and the Comprehensive Funding Program Waste Management with R's program: Reuse, Reduction, Recycling and Recovery for which there are grants ranging from 50% to 75%.


