Background 1985-1988

In the spring of 1985, a committee at Rideau District High School began to work toward the goal of improving cultural understanding between our students and students in a "sister" Soviet School. The first year the committee gathered community, school board and political support for its goal. In year two the committee sought and gained the support of Soviet Embassy personnel. That same year

The Rideau District High School Twinning Committee currently working on successful implementation of the attached itinerary for the Soviet visit in May. We hope to provide the same warm, welcome and enthusiastic interesting program for our visitors that they provided for the Rideau students who visited the Ukraine last May.
