\* pursuant to Section 2 of By-law 6-1988, Thomas Road be posted with reduced load signs commencing at Les Carrieres Granimar Lte' property to Rideau, the Company having agreed to maintain the posted road to Highway 15, as they move heavy loads during this period.

\* accepted and approved Road Budget totalling \$314,610 for construction and maintenance for 1989.

\* application to be made to Ministry of Transportation for supplementary allocations as follows:

- 1) re paving Upper Oak Leaf Rd - 56,750.00
- 2) repaving Short Point Rd - 81,000.00
- 3) New Backhoe - 45,000.00

\* purchased insurance coverage for 1989-90 from Frank Cowan Limited in accordance with Comprehensive Insurance Program in amount of \$15,798, plus increase for current number of Volunteer fire-fighters.

## A Night on the Town - In Your Own Village

Two years ago Rideau Lakes Union Library sponsored an adult/family series of five (5) evening theatre programs. Last year we did not do this. Instead, we brought children's programs to the communities and schools. We are once again wondering about presenting an adult series. We want to know what people like you in our various communities think about this idea.

We were considering a three (3) evening series:

1. A musician - perhaps a classical group like "Trio Arabesque".
2. A singer musician - such as Loreena McKennett, Celtic harpist or Alex Sinclair, guitarist.
3. A play - Rod Beattie with "Letters from Wingfield Farm".

Series, like this, have been suggested and tried in Perth, Almonte, Pembroke and Brockville and have proved to be very successful. This is an inexpensive way of bringing World Class entertainment directly into our local communities. Tickets would be about 1/2 the cost of an event in Ottawa or Toronto and that long weary drive is avoided. Artists would present an evening program of about 1 1/2 hours.

The Ontario Arts Council offers assistance - both money and advice to communities willing to organize such events.
