South Africa belongs to all who live in it and all should be equal before the law." Irene Goodsell read to us about the accepted definition of Stewardship. Everyone then repeated the Mizpah Benediction. Irene Goodsell, after decorating tables for Valentine's Day, served a tasty lunch, assisted by President Irma. Vivian then gave the courtesy. 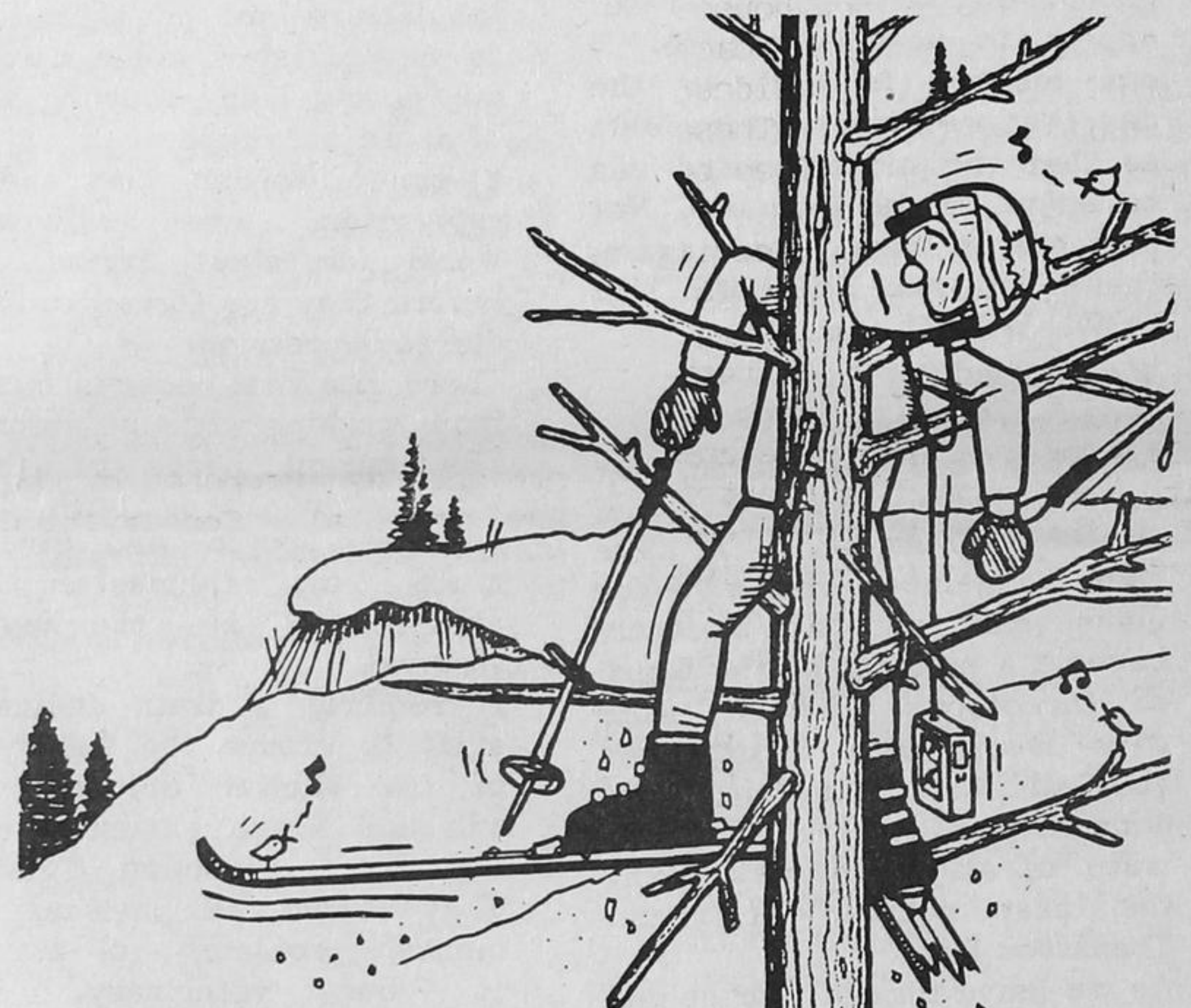
