NOTICE**

PERMIT FOR OPEN FIRE
ISSUED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION 2.6.3.4
ONTARIO FIRE CODE O. REGULATION 67/87

By-Law Number 695

Any person who is going to have an Open Fire for other than Cooking Food, must have a Permit For An Open Fire. These Permits can be obtained from the following people.

REGULATION # 9 (PERMIT)

Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this Code is liable for the Cost Incurred in bringing the resulting fire under control and/or a Fine of not more than Two Thousand Dollars, (\$2,000.00), exclusive of cost and a Corporation not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

I. COST INCURRED:

\$300.00 for the first hour spent by the Fire Station in whose area the fire is located and \$200.00 for each additional hour or part thereof for the Fire Station in whose area the fire is located at \$100.00 for each additional Tanker or Pumper required to Extinguish the Fire.

II. FINES:

First Offence - 10 percent of the Maximum Fine.
Second Offence - 20 percent of the Maximum Fine, (or left up to the discretion of the Fire Chief).

NOW THEREFORE: I, Arch Ostrom, Reeve of Bastard and South Burgess do hereby proclaim the week of April 8 - 14, 1990 as "National Wildlife Week" in the Township of Bastard and South Burgess, and urge all citizens to participate in initiating projects which will improve wildlife habitat in the Township.
