ELGIN U.C.W.

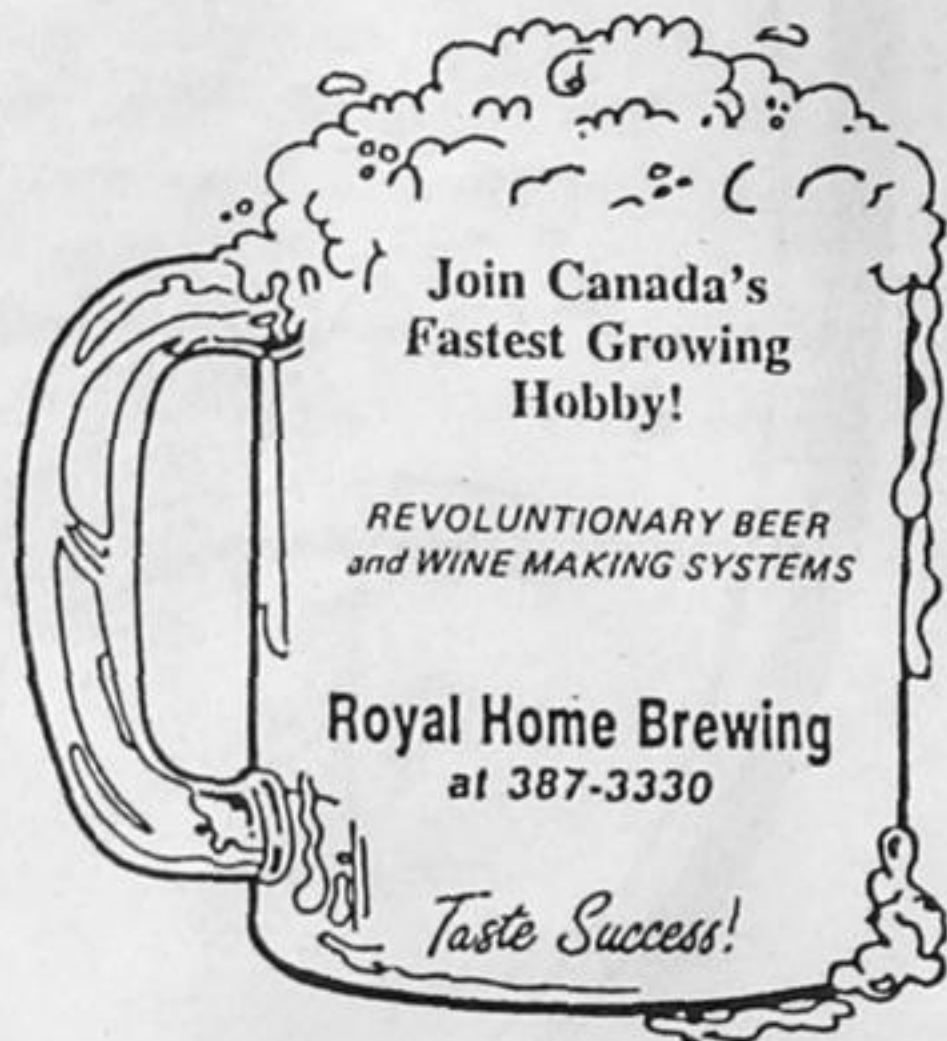
The UCW met February 13, 1990, with 21 members and 3 guests present.
