Ministry The Transportation has reconsidered our Speed Zone Reduction request on Highway the Hamlet of for They have agreed Portland. to reduce the speed to 60 km/hr from a point 100 metres south of Main Street to the beginning of the 80 km/hr just north of Cedar Valley Road. We are pleased as this was our major area of pedestrian for concern traffic.

Permission was granted to the O.P.P. to set up a part time location in the former clerk's office in the Old Town Hall, Delta.

of the 1990 budget).
