THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH CROSBY  
**NOTICE**  
The Township of South Crosby now have in existence a building for the storage of salt and sand. The salt and sand is used as a safety precaution on township roads during periods of inclement weather conditions.  
The existing building, which is a part of the existing municipal garage needs replacement for the following reasons:  
1. the sides of the structure are pushing out, subject to the interior weight and pressure of salt and sand;  
2. the area of the existing building is not sufficient to store the increased quantity of material required.  
Proposals to correct the situation are:  
1. to construct a new building in which to store the salt and sand;  
2. options for buildings being considered are:  
-Dome shaped building  
-OR-  
-GXT Salt Miser  
3. the new structure will be erected on township owned property, and will be adjacent to the existing municipal garage.  
The existing salt/sand storage building will be converted to a third Bay Garage, which is deemed necessary to house existing road department equipment.

The Council of The Corporation of the Township of South Crosby will further consider this proposal subject to the following:  
1. receipt of comments from the appropriate Ministries, Boards and neighbouring landowners.  
Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of South Crosby would appreciate receiving your written comments no later than June 4, 1990.

**NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS**

The RUNNING OF DOGS within the Township of South Crosby is PROHIBITED, and the owner of any dog running at large within the municipality shall be guilty of breach of Dog By-Law Number 674, and liable on conviction of the penalty provided in Section 5 of the By-Law, which is \$50.00 exclusive of costs recoverable under the provisions of the Provincial Offences Act.

Dog Kennel License cannot be issued without first contacting the Ministry of Health.

**FEES**

1. For a male dog, if only one is kept	\$ 6.00
2. For each additional male dog, owned by the same person, or kept in any one household	8.00
3. For a female dog, if only one is kept	10.00
4. For each additional female dog, owned by the same person, or kept in any one household	12.00
5. Kennel License	25.00
6. Dog tags (each)	0.25

Where a certificate of a Veterinary Surgeon is produced, showing that a female dog has been spayed, it shall be licensed at the same rate as a male dog.

Effective APRIL 1st, 1990, a penalty of \$1.00 was added to all dog licence fees as listed above.
