- \* authorized the Road Superintendent to call invitation tenders for 7000 tons of 5/8 crushed gravel, to be spread on Township roads, tenders to be sent to Sweet's Sand and Gravel, & W.P. Green & Sons. Tenders to close at 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, April 21, 1987 and to be opened at Council meeting that evening.

- \* no objection to severance being granted, provided adequate mainland parking and boat-launching facilities are provided and subject to 5% of value of land only for Park Purposes, re; severance #B-108-87, B-109-87 and B-110-87.
