With the additional volunteer assistance of Mrs. Brys Scovil, who does the final preparation of books for shelving, the "stock" shelves are almost empty... with the titles being distributed throughout the Union branches.

Interlibrary Loan continues to serve our public with extra-ordinary speed and continues to act as a support to our growing collection. The increase in use of Large Print material has been high and the Board will be investigating methods to increase the selection for users of these items.
