

RIDEAU SHOW SERIES 1987-88 SHOW DESCRIPTIONS

Paul Moreno Spanish Dance Co. May 20/87 Portland Comm. Hall

Formed in 1971 under the direction of Paul Moreno, the company has become one of the foremost Spanish Dance Ensembles in Canada. Since its first cross country tour in 1975, the company has consolidated its reputation by performing with sold out shows across Canada and in concert presentations as guests with leading symphony orchestras.

The show consists of an hour-long presentation, showcasing the passion and artistry of Spanish dance. Three dancers accompanied by a flamenco guitarist comprise the group.
