

VON Seniors Support Program
- North Leeds to soon begin!
There will be an open house

There will be an open house for the VON Seniors Support North Leeds Program April 22, 1:30-4 in its new office in the Home Video Building in Elgin. This program is formerly the VON Volunteer Visiting Program located in Bastard and South Burgess township. It is a recognition of the need to help our seniors to remain independent and comfortable in their homes. This is not a medical service. The open house celebrates the expansion of the services to include:

1. Volunteer Visiting seniors in Bastard and South Burgess township; North Crosby; South Crosby; Newboro and Westport villages. Seniors are matched on a 1.1 basis with people who are interested in friendly visiting and visits are considered social in nature. There is continual inservice training, support and supervision for volunteer visitors. Referrals are made to appropriate community agencies when appropriate. There is no charge for this service.

2. Information and Referral Service through telephone line/office with regular hours in the office will attempt to provide community members with information regarding community resources, general information, services for seniors. Telephone number 359-1068. Office hours are currently not fixed. (no charge)

3. Support to existing Wheels to Meals programs (no charge). 4. A home help registry will provide a list of names of persons who have indicated that they are willing to perform simple maintenance chores for seniors to assist them in remaining independent comfortable within and Any own homes. their arrangements for services and payment is the responsibility of the worker and senior.

5. Transportation Program to provide seniors (over age 60) with much needed to medical transportation appointments locally and in Kingston, Smiths Falls and Brockville. The Seniors Support Co-ordinator will match the needs of seniors to the availability of volunteer drivers. All arrangements are made through the Co-ordinator and minimum 4 day notification will be required. A small fee will be charged for this service.
