Mrs. Brown has been working with individual children for experience in counting, matching opposites, recognition of number symbols and colours. The newly acquired Snakes and Ladders game, Multilink toy (for counting and numbers) and alphabet cards have stimulated a keen interest in numbers and letters.

Drama is very popular at the moment; the children just love to act out songs and stories and have been entertaining their teachers!
