Under the Ontario Fire Code 'open air burning is not permitted unless approved or unless such burning consists of a small, confined fire, supervised at all times, and used to cook food on a grill or a barbeque'. 'Approved' is defined in the Fire Code as 'means approved by the Chief Fire Official'.

The Chief Fire Official for the Township of Rear of Leeds and Lansdowne has been designated by by-law and is the Fire Chief of the Seeley's Bay Fire Department, Tony Noakes, who may be contacted by calling the Fire Department business phone - 387-3197, or at his home, 387-3300.

ANYONE CONTRAVENING THE ONTARIO FIRE CODE CAN BE LIABLE FOR PENALTY
