BELL GENERAL STORE DELTA

Years of looking at the old general store building deteriorate on Delta's main street bothered a Delta family, so they decided to buy it and give it the respect it deserves.

The Bell General Store was built before 1861. The store was run by James Bell and served the Delta community until the family sold it in 1956.

In 1960, the building got a new tenant, an apron factory, which operated out of the building for three years.

The building has been vacant for a long period of time. Each year its condition grew worse.

Penstone family wanted put stop the to deterioration, so in the spring of 1987 the former general store and apron factory will become a craft shop.

Bill and Betty Penstone, their son David and daughter Nancy came to the Delta area seven years ago, when they purchased the Cedar Knoll Camps, which they still own and operate. Bill Penstone is a retired vice-president of DX Company in Montreal. His wife worked as a school secretary and recently retired.

Their daughter's background is in crafts, and that is the main reason why the building will be turned into a craft shop.

The plan is to restore the building and have it ready to open for the Delta Maple Syrup Festival in March.

"The festival brings about 4,000 people to the area. We want to open the shop on that weekend to help contribute to the success of the festival." said the daughter.

The name of the business will be The Old Apron Factory Craft Shop to try and keep some tradition of the building, Mr. Penstone said. The store will carry a wide variety of including knitting items, supplies, needle point, children's crafts and of course aprons.

Mr. Penstone said he also hopes to carry a variety of kites. He said people love to fly kites in the Beverley Township Park directly behind the old general store.

The family says it likes the Delta area and wants to help promote tourism. "We would like to get postcards with local scenes. People are always asking for them at the camp," said Miss Penstone.

There are some advantages to having a craft shop in Delta, the family says. Now supplies for all kinds of different hobbies will be available right in Delta.

Having a shop in Delta will be good for area artists as well. "We will be encouraging local artist's work. We will take their work on consignment," said the daughter.

"We are going to have handmade gifts for the tourists to purchase. These will be gifts made by artists." local The artists will also be able to use the shop as a location for teaching. The shop will offer lessons

in various crafts. Once the store is in operation, Miss Penstone hopes to hire one full-time and one part-time

salesman.

The second floor of the historic building will also be renovated, Mr. Penstone said. It will/ be an apartment, but won't be complete until September.

Mr. Penstone plans to do most the renovations himself. first step is to repair the roof. The bricks must be repointed, and the chimney also needs to be repaired, he said.

There was an old shed attached to the building. Mr. Penstone already taken it down and is going to build a deck for people to sit on during the summer. He joked that love for building patio decks is the real reason why he bought the building. building decks. I build these decks around my house. I ran out of places to build. Now I can build some more decks," he said.




