After the talk, Mr. Judge showed slides of the Algonquin children in their schools. He answered questions about his work for about thirty minutes. The UCW was then given the business report after which the evening was closed with refreshments.

**SOUTH CROSBY TOWNSHIP COUNCIL NOTES**

**Sept. 15th & Oct. 6th**

- Capital expenditures at Township Park were discussed. It was agreed that brush that has been cut and piled, be disposed of this fall, with use of chipper and the placement of fill be done. Reeve advised Council that he spoke with Edmund Kenney and he confirmed that he had donated a pump and tank to the park. Clerk is to contact Everton Strong and/or Elaine St. Pierre to see if they know what happened to these.

- Don Warren reported to Council regarding revenue, expenses, proposed projects and needs of Elgin Community Centre.

- passed a motion that Council are in agreement with terms for obtaining land from Mr. Allan Burt, for construction on part of the Clear Lake Road. A formal agreement is to be drawn up, listing all conditions.

- passed a Resolution to petition the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for Interim payment on the Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act on expenditures Jan. 1st to Aug. 31st, 1986. Construction \$15,439.33 and Maintenance \$113,864.62

- passed a motion to absorb all insurance coverage which relates to the Rideau Lakes Union Library, under Township of South Crosby insurance policy.

- Proclamation for World Food Day was declared by Council and same is to be published in North Leeds Lantern.

- motion that Council object to Land Severance in the name of Victor Pergat due to the fact that it does not front on a municipal maintained road, or does not have water access and therefore is in contravention of the Official Plan and Zoning By-law.

- Clerk is authorized to write a letter to Mr. Lloyd Standen, village of Morton and request that property be cleared of weeds, etc.

- Road Superintendent has purchased a one way plough for \$500.

- work has been started on the moving of the Trotter building

- Land Severances in the names of Eva Baxter and Frank White were tabled

- Council objected to Land Severances in the name of Donald Pyne due to the fact that they are in contravention of section 4.1.2 of the Official Plan

- Council has no objections to Land Severances in the name of Brad Johnson Assoc. Ltd and Blumont Estates

- passed a motion to authorize Clerk to provide assistance, for a township resident as needed

- Council authorized Reeve to sign the agreement between Township and the Canadian Red Cross for 1986 amended rates.

- supported the proposed adjustment to wage rates for Homemaker Services, from \$4.00 to \$4.35 and also an additional 8¢ per hour increase retroactive to Jan. 1st, 1986, to reimburse for increase in Worker's Compensation Board assessment rates

- supported Canadian Red Cross Society, Brockville Branch, in their application for an employee for the West Leeds Office, under the Social Service Employment Program
