



SOUTH CROSBY COUNCIL NOTES

The first regular meeting of the month was held Aug. 5 at the Municipal Office with all council members present.

Copies of the minutes of July 21 regular meeting and of special public meeting to consider zoning amendments were distributed to council members for their perusal and approved.

Business Arising:

- Will take no further action re request for donation towards the purchase of a wheelchair for William Ubdegrove until further information is received from Ontario March of Dimes

- no response from Canadian Red Cross re our request of break-down on rates for homemaker services

- moved that Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority be requested to consider a floating dock and six benches for Township Park

- following discussion re community centres and township owned buildings, clerk to write letter to chairman of each committee on Board and ask who holds an entrance key to each building

- Policy and Procedures Committee to meet to discuss policies on road closings

- moved that council agree that the Subdividers Agreement between Township of South Crosby and Mr. Michael Meredith, upon written approval from Robert Scott, Solicitor, be signed and executed

- discussion re condition of Davis Lock Road, past and present maintenance and repairs, road grants, etc. - Road Superintendent was instructed to see that

large stones on Davis Lock Road are removed and to do a study with regards to need for gravel

- Reeve reported to council on Special In-Camera meeting regarding matter of concern at the Summer Playground Program - moved that the following recommendations be forwarded to the chairman of the Recreation Program:

1. Co-ordinator of the Summer Playground Program be appointed annually, by the Recreation Committee

2. The Chairman of Recreation, council member on Recreation Committee and the Co-ordinator of Summer Playground, act as a committee for hiring of employees for the Summer Playground

3. The Co-ordinator make a monthly report to Recreation Committee on the activities of the Summer Playground Program

- Reeve, Deputy-Reeve and Council Member Wayne Sly are to act as a committee for hiring an employee to do some brushing and clearing at township park and they are to also investigate the placement of some fill at the park

- Road Voucher No. 14, in the amount of \$5,856.30 was accepted and paid

- Road Superintendent's report:

1. sign for the dump site is in place

2. the checker board sign and two corner signs for the Jones Falls Road will be put up within the next week

3. Work on Smiths Road has been completed and the dump road is almost completed

4. Work on the Bush Road should be completed towards the end of the week

5. ditching has been completed on Smiths Road alongside Dennison's barn, the culvert widened and gravel put on road. More work has to be done beside the cemetery

6. Some stumps and rock have been removed on the Wrights Road, do to some complaints that it was a dangerous corner

- Accounts in the amount of \$635.95 were accepted and paid

- moved that the council agree to proceed with stopping up, closing and selling of

portion of unopened road allowance as requested by Ruby Roantree

- following land severances were approved by council: 1. R.A. Howard Bus Service Ltd. B-337-86

2. C.N. Railway B-345-86 - Miscellaneous items discussed: re fence being erected by Mr. Cassall; wood piled on township road allowance, in area of Sand Lake; and private property which needs cleaning up.
