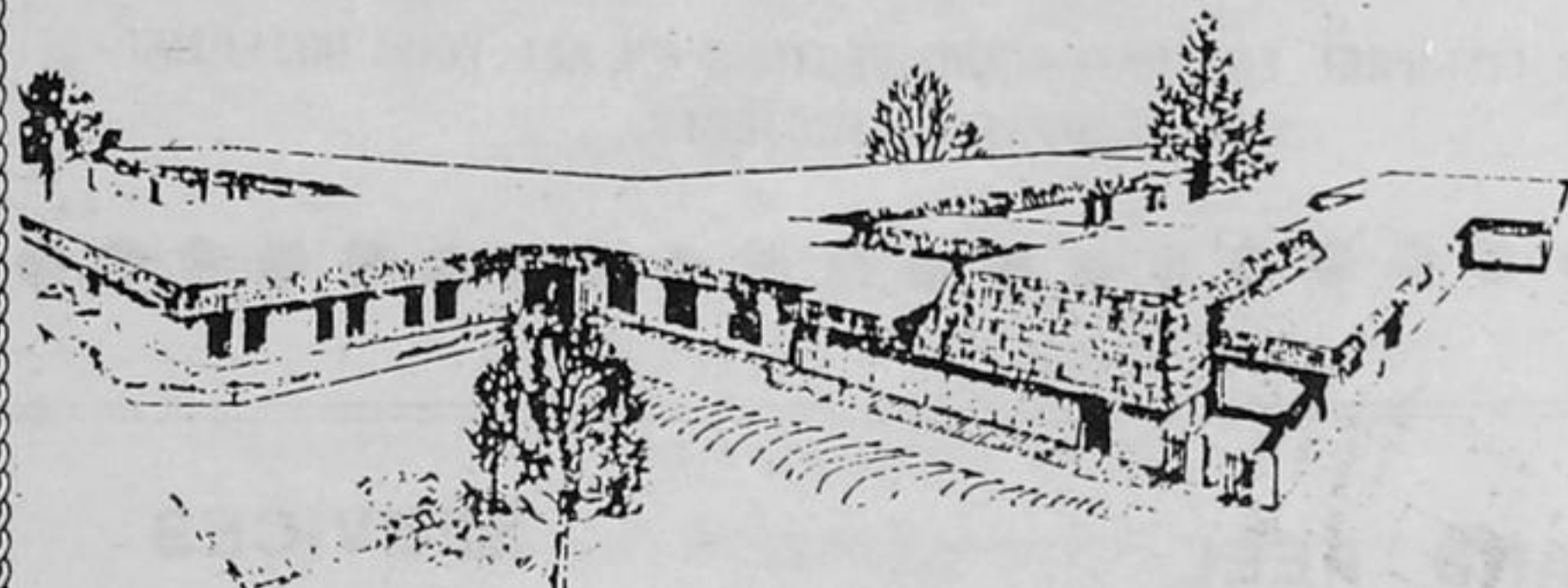

"Quest for Success" is a challenging new 4-H project aimed at giving senior members 16-21 years of age the edge on career planning.

Emphasis is placed on career selection, creative job search techniques, and rights and responsibilities in the workforce.

The meeting will enable members to learn the four stages of career planning, how to write a resume and covering letter, how to look for a job, how to physically and mentally prepare for an interview and ways to make the most of their first working experience. Members will also be made aware of labour unions and the pros and cons of self-employment.

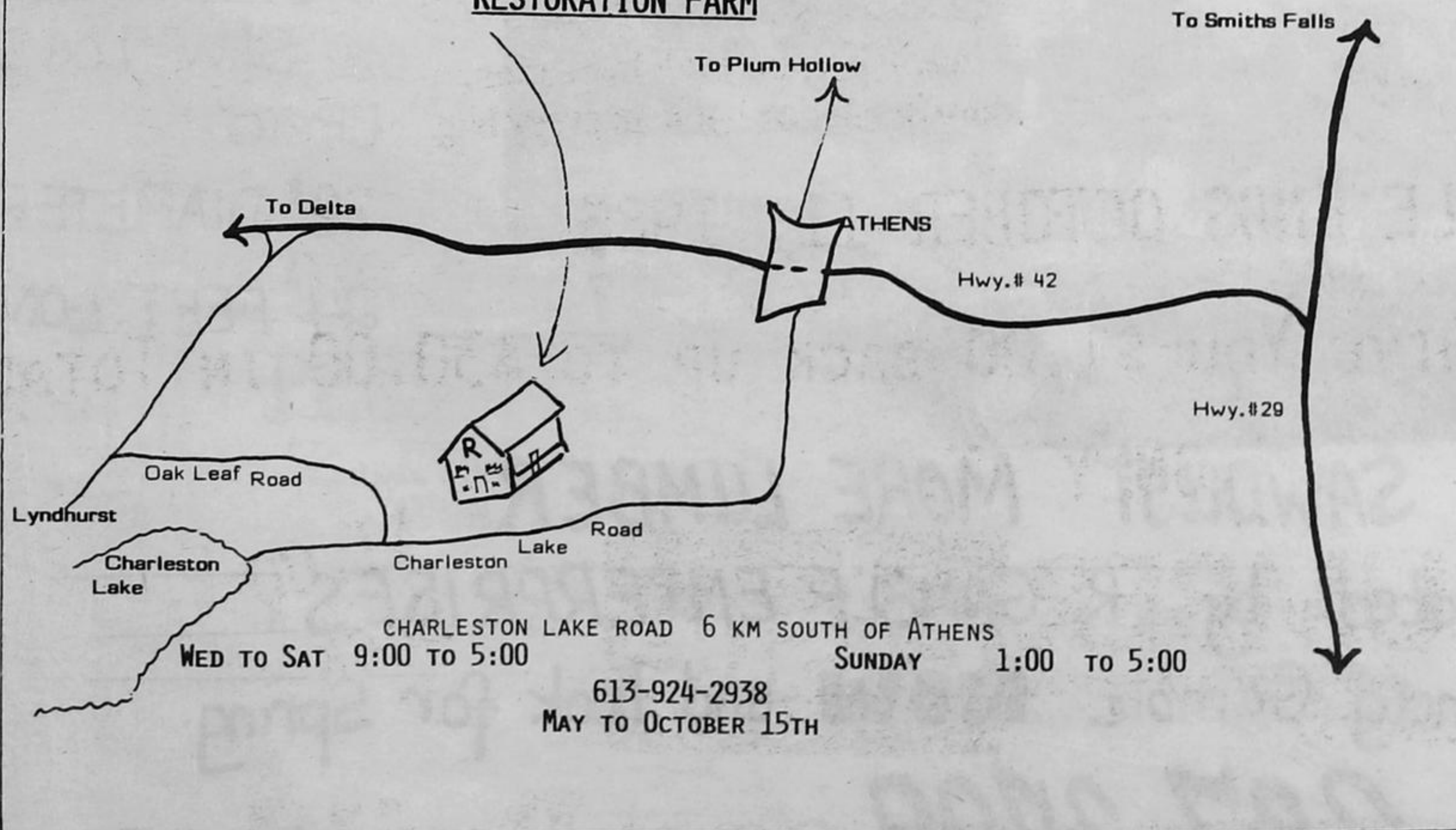
**FOR THE LIBRARY**
