Following the service, the children participated in the annual picnic. A tour of the Old Delta Mill was conducted followed by singing and playing games. Lunch was served.

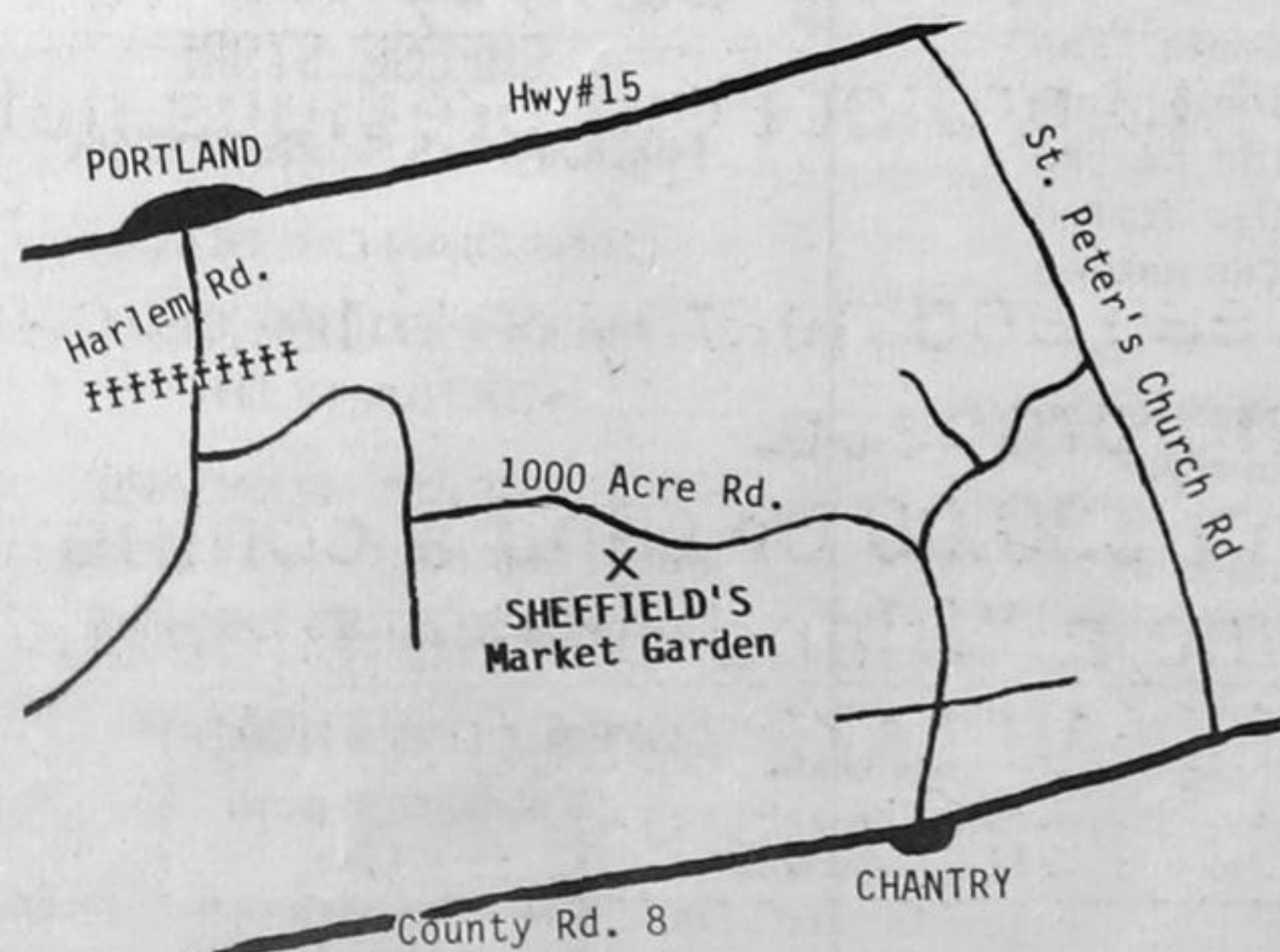
