WEED ALERT IS HERE AGAIN

If you have problem weeds that need identification, or you think you have a new weed, we can help you. The objectives of Weed Alert are to assemble information on problem weeds as they now exist in the province and to identify and record new weeds as they appear. Weeds suspected of being triazine resistant can also be tested. Responsibility for the field work of the program rests with the summer students working with the Soils and Crops Specialists.
