On June 11-13th, the grade 8's will be going to Quebec City. They had a Jog-a-thon to raise money for this trip.


On June 17 and 19th our boys will be going to Rideau Vista and Beverley to play 3-Pitch.


Grade 7's will be going to high school.

On June 24th, Grade 7 & 8's will be having a closing ceremonies for the Grade 8's going to high schools. The D.J. is Jim Elliott.


Grade 8 was quilting. They made a nice quilt with help of Velma Kelsey and Vera McElroy.
